#### PRINCIPAL'S MESSAGE

The pride of being an Indian is paramount as the country registers phenomenal growth and the world witnesses values which have charted this ascent. Scientific temperament, sustainability, innovation and inclusivity, are a few of these values and quality education is a cornerstone of them all. It is with immense pride I state that at Maitreyi College, we too are driven by these values. The year's achievements reflect a fulfilment of this goal. This feeling of pride is even more special, as I present this year's Annual Report as a Permanent Principal of this college. Today as we witness the **58th Annual Day of Maitreyi College**, I warmly welcome all our esteemed guests on this important occasion, as we celebrate the achievements and contributions of each member of the *Maitreyi Kutumb*. The Upanishads reiterate *Vasudaiva Kutumbukam* and we at Maitreyi also view ourselves as a *kutumb*, a family, that strives for excellence and works towards effective contribution to society and the nation at large. With this thought I warmly welcome you all.

We have amongst us Shri K.N. Shrivastava, Director, India International Centre, New Delhi as our Chief Guest. We welcome you Sir! Mr. Shrivastava had an outstanding career as an Indian Administrative Service Officer of Karnataka Cadre. He joined IAS in 1978 and superannuated in 2014. He held several important positions in Dairying, Power, Irrigation, Urban - Transportation and Mining sectors in Karnataka State. Mr. Shrivastava's most notable achievement was the implementation of Upper Krishna Project, an Irrigation and Power Project across Krishna River which now provides irrigation to about 15 lakh acres of agricultural lands in the northern districts of Karnataka and generates about 300 megawatt of power. It also provides drinking water to over 2000 villages and to a large number of towns. Mr. Shrivastava successfully managed Hutti Gold Mining Co., the lone gold producing company in India, for 5 years as its chairman & Managing Director. He was the first Managing Director of Bangalore Metro Rail Corporation. In the Central Government, Mr. Shrivastava worked in the Ministries of Civil Aviation, External Affairs, Culture, Railways and Earth Sciences. He also worked as Director General of Archaeological Survey of India. He retired from the post of Secretary, Ministry of Civil Aviation, Government of India. Post

retirement, Mr. Shrivastava worked as a Member, National Disaster Management Authority (NDMA) in the rank of Minister of State, Government of India and as a Judge in Central Administrative Tribunal, before joining as Director of India International Centre, New Delhi in 2019. It is our honour to have you sir amidst us today!

It is a pleasure to have with us as our Guest of Honour, **Prof. Anu Aggarwal, Treasurer, Governing Body, Maitreyi College.** She is a Professor in the Department of Operational Research with more than 22 years of experience. She is also an Honorary Professor in the Faculty of Open learning, University of Delhi. Her key research interests include mathematical modelling and optimization in Consumer Buying Behaviour, Innovation-Diffusion modelling; Electronic Commerce. Prof. Aggarwal has more than 120 research publications and has guided more than 20 M.Phil. and 7 Ph.D. students. In 2009, she was awarded Young Researcher Award for Applications of Soft Computing Techniques in Software Reliability at 4th International Conference on Quality, Reliability and Infocom Technology. She has also been Member of the UGC Expert Committee for evaluation of Colleges & State Universities. We welcome you!

Presiding over the occasion we have with us **Prof. Jagreet Kaur, Chairperson Governing Body, Maitreyi College,** University of Delhi. Prof. Kaur is a Professor at the Department of Genetics, University of Delhi and has an experience of over 18 years. Her research focusses on understanding the genetics of resistance to major pathogens. Her work has had a global impact. She was a Postdoctoral Fellow at Max Planck Institute for Plant Breeding, Germany. She has guided many PhD scholars, has several Masters Research Trainees and Summer Trainees working under her supervision. She has over 30 publications in journals of international repute and book chapters. A recipient of various project grants, Prof. Kaur is a seminal name in the field of Genetics. We warmly welcome you!

As our special invitee we have with us **Shri Manoj Agrawal Ji, Member, Governing Body,** Maitreyi College. He is a renowned Chartered Accountant with over 28 years of experience in Audit, Direct Tax, Finance and Consultancy. He has held various positions of responsibility such as Treasurer, Jan Kalyan Nyas, Delhi, Vice-President, Sewa Bharti, West Delhi among various other significant positions. We welcome you! We also have with us as our **Special Invitee, Shri Deo Dharam Choudhary Ji, Member, Governing Body,** Maitreyi College who is also a renowned industrialist. We welcome you! We also welcome **Ms. Preeti Dogra, Member, Governing Body,** Maitreyi College who is also our Special Invitee for the day. Ms. Dogra is a Social Worker of repute. She is Vice President SC/ST Board of Delhi, and has played a crucial part in elections. I also welcome our faculty members, retired faculty members, alumni, non-teaching staff, parents and dear students.

Before I share with you the key highlights of our institution's achievements in the past one year, I'd like to mention that the year 2024-25 proved to be a yet another significant year as several awards and recognitions came our way:

- NAAC accredited A++ and NIRF Rank 29, our college received an All India Rank 11 under the non-autonomous category, in the Education World India Higher Education Rankings. This rank is based on *perception* of the institution nationwide.
- The College also got the 'Best Innovator Award' at the International Skill, Startup, and Entrepreneurship Exhibition organised by the University of Delhi. 27 faculty members from various departments represented the institution and received the award.
- We also received 'Environmental Sustainable Education Distinction Award' by the Indian Institute of Ecology and Environment. Prof. Rama Sisodia (Botany) and Dr. P. Kavita (Botany) received the award on behalf of the college.

- For value education, the college received 'Divine Wisdom Award for Spiritual Education', at the Spiritual and Value Education Summit 2025. Dr. Kamal Sharma (Botany), Dr. Shweta Sharma (Botany), and Ms. Aditi Ahlawat (Environmental Science) received the award on behalf of the college.
- The college also received 'World Peace Education Promotion Award' at the World Peace Congress 2024, organized by International Association of Educators for World Peace. Prof. Pinky B. Gandhi (Vice-Principal), Prof. Ranjana Bhattacharya (History) and Dr. Rachna Jain (Economics) received the award.
- Significantly, early this year we witnessed our **first Academia-Industry collaboration** with Vikas Lifecare Ltd, for research in Nanotechnology. The college received lab equipment and chemicals worth Rs. 11 lakhs and a cheque of Rs. 2.5 lakhs.
- Here I'd like to mention that our College was **one of the first few colleges to organize a Faculty Development Program on AI and Pedagogy**. It was titled '*Reinventing Pedagogy in the Age of AI: Methods, Approaches & Perspectives*'.
- Department of Commerce organized a **Two-day National Conference** on 'Viksit Bharat 2047: Reimagining Management and Business Practices in the Age of AI'. For this, they received a grant of Rs. 2.5 lakhs from ICSSR and a grant from Punjab National Bank.
- During our Annual International Conference *Equinox 2024*, the college had the privilege of hosting a Book Launch of *Genome to Om: Evolving Journey of Modern Science to Metascience* authored by **Prof. Bhushan Patwardhan**, National Research Professor at the Ministry of Ayush, Government of India and Ms. Indu Ramchandani. We were honoured to have as our Chief Guest **Prof. Yogesh Singh**, **Hon'ble Vice Chancellor**, **University of Delhi**. The Book Discussion involved Dr. Rajiv Kumar (Former Vice-Chairman, NITI Aayog), Sh.Vaidya Rajesh Kotecha (Ministry of Ayush), Dr. Vinay Sahasrabuddhe (Former Member of Parliament and President, ICCR), Dr. Shashikala (Vice Chancellor, National Institute of Educational Planning and Administration (NIEPA), Dr. Jayant Deopujari (Chairman, NCISM), among various other eminent personalities.
- I'm happy to share that this year with the publication of the April 2025 issue of *Vantage: Journal of Thematic Analysis*, International Peer-reviewed Open Access Multidisciplinary Journal (ISSN 2582-7391), we achieved another milestone. The journal is now published on **OJS-PKP platform, with a fully automated submission and review system**. Another new initiative of the Centre for Research, *Prashikshuta Programme*, was also launched. It enables the faculty to mentor students from other institutions for internships and projects. Eight internships were successfully undertaken- a promising start to interinstitutional academic exchange.
- Combining our commitment to innovation and inclusion, in collaboration with the NGO Cure India, the college developed India's First Indoor Navigation App-Canary, launched by Hon'ble Cabinet Minister Dr. Virender Kumar Ji, Ministry of Social Justice and Empowerment, Government of India, at Pandit Deendayal Upadhyay National Institute for Persons with Physical Disability. 7 students from our college were part of the App Development team. Another project, AXI Technology of Accessible Art, was inaugurated during Astitwa, NSS Fest 2025. This technology, a joint effort of Cure India, other experts and our NSS students enables the visually challenged individuals to experience art.
- The college hosted over 200 dignitaries across various cultural and academic events in 2024-25.
- The college also won **24 Awards** at the **Annual Flower Show 2025**, organised by University of Delhi.

• Maitreyi College was also honoured with the title 'Eat Right Campus' by FSSAI for the duration August 1, 2024 to July 31, 2026.

#### Academic Excellence

In 2024-25, the college witnessed 1010 first divisions in the first year, 905 in the second year and 972 in the third year, while the pass percentage was over 94%. Here, I'd like to mention **Aahna Tanwar**, a student of Department of Economics who cleared the university exam with a CGPA of 9.52 (95.27%) and stood First in Delhi University. My congratulations!

Our students have also made a distinctive mark in All India Competitive Exams. Cdt. Sgt Akanksha Chand secured AIR 72 in NDA and NA (I) examination. Cdt. Panjul Singh cleared SSB with AIR 73. Cdt. Riya Mina secured First Position in a quiz competition organised by the Delhi Directorate. Here, I would like to mention a flagship initiative by IQAC, the Meritorious Student Award, which has been instituted to acknowledge the efforts and achievements of our students. Student Progression Reports indicate the multifaceted engagements of our students across various domains, not just within college but also at the State, National and International level. A third year student of B.Sc.(H) Physics, Ms. Aliya, was selected for a Summer Student Program at the Institute of Physics, Academia Sinica, Taiwan and another student, Ms. Himani Chaudhary, B.Sc. Life Science, Third Year, is all set to join the M.Sc. Program at the prestigious Indian Institute of Science, Bangalore. My best wishes!

#### Learning Outcome: Research and Cultural Excellence

We proudly note that classroom teaching has inspired many of our students to engage in academic projects under the mentorship of our faculty. During the Summer Internship Program (SIP) 2024, organized by the Centre for Research, we witnessed completion of 28 research projects involving over 85 students and over 44 faculty members. The theme for the SIP 2023–24 was *Systems of Knowledge in India: Moving Towards Self-Reliance.* 3 Annual Research Projects (ARPs) involved 8 faculty members and 15 students. Apart from these projects incubated by Centre for Research (CFR), 5 other projects were undertaken by 12 of our students under the mentorship of our faculty members. They presented their findings at various platforms outside college and won accolades. With this, the total number of research projects in the year 2024-2025 comes to 36, involving 112 students. My congratulations to the students and the faculty for taking the spirit of learning beyond classroom.

Our students stood out in extra-curricular activities as well. Maitreyi College has a vibrant mix of 41 cultural and academic societies, various clubs and cells, offering students a platform to sharpen their skills beyond classroom. This year, the college achieved remarkable success in cultural competitions, winning a total of 184 awards. Additionally, students actively participated in NCC and NSS events, representing the college at various forums. Aditya R, a student of B.A. (Hons.) Political Science emerged a National Winner, securing 1st position in Solo Classical Dance Competition at the 37th (2024) and 38th (2025), National Youth Festival organized by the Association of Indian Universities. I'm happy to mention that this year, Maitreyi College, for the very first time, hosted the Model United Nations (MUN) and Asian Parliamentary Debate in the college. This was organized by Trenchant, the English Debating Society. My congratulations to the team!

Students' achievements are a true measure of success of the teaching-learning in an institution. The achievements of our faculty also testify to this fact. Last year, we witnessed 115 research publications by our faculty members, 54 paper presentations, in addition to 14 books and 22 book

chapters authored. Further, 15 faculty members won various awards and distinctions and 5 teachers were awarded Ph.D. in their respective areas of expertise. It is a matter of immense pride for our institution that 14 faculty members are also recognized as PhD supervisors at present. Additionally, 159 FDPs, FIPs, and other programs saw our faculty in attendance, reflecting their endeavour to up-skill themselves. 122 teachers were also invited as speakers and experts for various research and training programs.

In the year 2024-25, the college published 2 issues each of Peer-reviewed e-Research Magazine, *Samvedna* (ISSN 2581-9917) and *Vantage: Journal of Thematic Analysis*, International Peer-reviewed Open Access Multidisciplinary Journal (ISSN 2582-7391), and one issue of multilingual college magazine *Maitreyi* (ISBN (978-81-952826-1-6) in addition to around 19 newsletters and magazines released by different departments, cells and clubs in the college. I'm happy to share that even our students contribute to knowledge creation with their participation in the Editorial Team of these magazines and newsletters. My congratulations to everyone!

#### Innovation and Skill Enhancement

One of the foremost examples of innovation, skill enhancement and employability are the entrepreneurial ventures in our college. The college has 21 startups conceptualised and run by our students and faculty. And this number keeps growing each year. Here, I would like to mention Kasturi Herbals, a faculty-led startup of 100% natural personal care products. This venture has grown extensively over the last one year with a total of 75 products. Their products comprise personal care products for kids, men and women, and care products for pets as well. They also have a range of medicated products. The venture has received wide attention, even globally. A professor from Poland used products by Kasturi Herbals and highly appreciated them. Last year, he visited our college only to procure some of these products for himself and his family. He is Prof. Mariusz Misztal, Professor of History, who also holds the Chair Institute of English Studies at the University of National Education Commission, Krakow, Poland. This startup also garnered attention at the International Skill, Startup, and Entrepreneurship Exhibition organised by University of Delhi. Kasturi Herbals was an outcome of the Skill Enhancement Course 'Chemistry of Cosmetics'. Here, I must also mention that Delhi University sanctioned a grant of Rs. 15 lakhs for our college Skill Centre Atharvan. This will provide a major impetus in skill-development and enhancement at Maitreyi.

Our student Ishita, from B.A.(P) Computer Applications, formed her startup, *IYRA Media*, which was listed by Silicon India Magazine as one of the 'Ten Best Influencer Marketing Startups 2024' Unmodaya Foundation's *Riding Rangers*, a startup of our alumna Riya Aggarwal, was awarded Best Innovator at the International Skill, Startup, and Entrepreneurship Exhibition organised by the University of Delhi, September 4-6, 2024. Jhanvi Sharma, a student of 2020 batch, formed her startup *Stay-Mentor* while in college, and since then it has achieved great heights. Until last year, her startup had helped 564 out-station students for accommodation. She generated a revenue of Rs. 3 lakhs with profit of Rs 1.8 lakhs. All our startups are a result of immense hardwork and dedication of our students and teachers, all the year round. My congratulations to them all.

It is a matter of pride to note here that ventures by our faculty, current students and even those by our former students enrich the startup ecosystem at Maitreyi, making it a robust hub of innovation. The college Garden Committee also spearheaded a unique initiative. Students under the mentorship of the faculty undertook the generation of QR Codes for all trees and plants on the college campus. These QR Codes carry details of each tree and plant, enabling ease of identification and creating a digital database of the college flora.

Academic and research initiatives are supplemented by our college library which continues to be a valuable resource for all. Last year, the library enhanced its digital presence. The subscription to One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) and N-LIST Consortium, also enabled access to global research as well as DU e-library e-resources. Further the library is equipped with latest versions of the Plagiarism check software such as Turnitin and Drillbit. An all new RFID system was also installed and launched in the library last year, automating various processes.

Another aspect of experiential learning is evident through numerous educational trips undertaken last year. Over 40 field trips were organized by different departments to various labs, museums, NGOs, historical excavation sites, ecological conservation facilities among others, offering students an opportunity to experience relevance of theoretical concepts in real life. These visits formed a veritable bridge between the classroom and the industry.

#### **Employability**

This atmosphere of research and innovation in the college, led to significant milestones in employability of our students. During the Placement Drive *Envision*, out of 978 applicants exclusively for internships, 408 students got internship offers with the highest internship stipend being Rs. 25000. And out of 201 applicants for jobs, 68 were placed successfully. The college witnessed a footfall of 45 companies for job hirings and 118 companies who came for hiring students for internships. These numbers indicate the dynamism of both, our students and teachers whose efforts take the teaching-learning process to this fruitful juncture, where we witness our students become successful working professionals.

#### Inclusivity

Various initiatives in the college reflect our efforts in the domain of inclusivity, but I will highlight just a few. In collaboration with the Special Olympics Bharat, NGO CURE India, Rotary Club, the college organized various events. In July last year, we jointly organised a National Football Coaching Preparatory Training Camp for Indian athletes participating in the Gothia Cup in Sweden. We trained 46 para-athletes in skill, strategy, and teamwork. Further, we jointly hosted the Special Olympics Asia Pacific Regional Games in November 2024. This witnessed participation from 12 countries. On our Annual Sports Day 2025, we felicitated Differently Abled students who won awards in different sports across various competitions. This was an initiative by the college to encourage unified sports.

The college NSS in association with The Rotaract Club of Delhi Midtown Maitreyi organized various camps and programs. NSS also organized *Navoudit*, a festival where underprivileged school children, trained by our students, participate in various competitions and events showcasing their talent. This event witnessed participation of over 2000 children. Last month, our NSS students were selected as volunteers for the Jnanpith Award 2025 at Vigyan Bhawan, New Delhi. It was a moment of immense pride for the entire Maitreyi fraternity. And as I had mentioned in the beginning of my address, our collaboration with NGO Cure India led to the development of technology that proved decisive in the domain of accessibility. Both, the indoor navigation app and the AXI technology that make art accessible to the visually impaired-both are significant efforts in the direction of inclusivity.

#### **Other Significant Developments**

During the last financial year, we undertook significant infrastructure upgradations ranging from the installation of 70 CCTV cameras across the college campus, to procurement of 25 All-in-One Computers, one state-of-the-art interactive panel, construction of a new Tissue Culture

Laboratory, development of a new Rock Garden, laying of the IGL Gas Pipeline, installation of the RFID system in the college library among various other additions. Here, I must acknowledge the efforts of entire Non-Teaching Staff in facilitating procurement and successful implementation of these facilities. Not just in administrative work, our Non-teaching staff also bring laurels with their active participation in other initiatives as well. They won the Dr. Savita Datta Memorial 5th T-20 Cricket Tournament, winning against cricket teams from across all colleges of the University. Further, a cricket team of the college, comprising both teaching and non-teaching staff, led by our Administrative Officer, Mr. Ranu, were Runners-up in the Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar College Staff Cricket Tournament. Mr. Anil Chhillar (Lab Attendant, Department of Zoology) received the Best Batsmen award in Delhi University Staff Club T-20 Cricket Tournament.

Each year, on the Annual Day, while we celebrate our achievements, we also take a moment to fondly cherish the contribution of those who superannuated in the past one year. Prof. Ranjana Bhattacharya, Department of History, retired this year in January. We fondly cherish her academic rigour and not to forget her exceptional talent of singing. Sh. Hans Raj Saklani, Lab Assistant, Department of Chemistry also completed his term of service with us in March this year, while Sh. VK Rai, Lab Assistant, Department of Chemistry and Mrs. Meena Malhotra, Technical Assistant, Botany Lab and Zoology Lab completed their term in December last year. The lab work would not have been as seamless, without the able presence of Sh. Saklani ji, Sh. Rai and Mrs. Malhotra. We wish them health and happiness, as they enter a yet another beautiful phase of life.

As our achievements continue, I now draw my speech to a close. I hope the tradition of academic distinction, innovation and holistic development continues to inspire us all and we achieve new milestones each year. I'd like to thank the IQAC for their hard work in compiling the Annual Report, the Students Union convenors and their entire team, the convenors and members of all college committees and the non-teaching staff for their constant support and contribution. Thanks are due also to the teaching and non-teaching staff for their contribution to the smooth functioning of the NCWEB and SOL centres in our college throughout the year. Our collective efforts have ensured successful completion of this academic year! Id like to conclude with the following few lines:

छात्रों की उपलब्धियाँ किसी संस्थान में शिक्षण-अध्ययन के माहौल की सफलता का सही मापदंड होती हैं। और हमारे संकाय सदस्यों की उपलब्धियाँ भी इस तथ्य की गवाही देती हैं। पिछले साल, हमने अपने संकाय सदस्यों द्वारा 115 शोध प्रकाशन, 54 पेपर प्रस्तुतियाँ, 14 पुस्तकें और 22 पुस्तक अध्यायों के लेखन को देखा। इसके अलावा, 15 संकाय सदस्यों ने विभिन्न पुरस्कार जीते और 5 शिक्षकों को उनकी विशेषज्ञता के क्षेत्रों में पीएचडी से सम्मानित किया गया। यह हमारे संस्थान के लिए बहुत गर्व की बात है कि वर्तमान में 14 संकाय सदस्यों को पीएचडी पर्यवेक्षक के रूप में भी मान्यता प्राप्त है। इसके अतिरिक्त, 159 एफडीपी, एफआईपी और अन्य कार्यक्रमों में हमारे संकाय सदस्यों ने भाग लिया, जो खुद को बेहतर बनाने के उनके प्रयास को दर्शाता है। 122 शिक्षकों को विभिन्न शोध और प्रशिक्षण कार्यक्रमों के लिए वक्ता और विशेषज्ञ के रूप में भी आमंत्रित किया गया था। वर्ष 2024-25 में, कॉलेज ने पीयर-रिव्यूड ई-रिसर्च मैगज़ीन, संवेदना (ISSN 2581-9917) और वैंटेज: जर्नल ऑफ़ थीमैटिक एनालिसिस, इंटरनेशनल पीयर-रिव्यूड ओपन एक्सेस मल्टीडिसिप्लिनरी जर्नल (ISSN 2582-7391) के 2-2 अंक और बहुभाषी कॉलेज पत्रिका मैत्रेयी (ISBN (978-81-952826-1-6) का एक अंक प्रकाशित किया। मुझे यह बताते हुए खुशी हो रही है कि हमारे छात्र भी कॉलेज द्वारा प्रकाशित विभिन्न पत्रिकाओं के संपादक के रूप में अपने योगदान के साथ ज्ञान सृजन में योगदान दे रहे हैं। इसके अलावा कॉलेज में विभिन्न विभागों, प्रकोशों और क्लबों द्वारा जारी किए गए लगभग 19 समाचार पत्र और पत्रिकाएँ भी प्रकाशित की गईं।

#### नवाचार और कौशल संवर्धन

नवाचार, कौशल वृद्धि और रोजगार के सबसे प्रमुख उदाहरणों में से एक हमारे कॉलेज में उद्यमशीलता के उपक्रम हैं। कॉलेज ने हमारे छात्रों और शिक्षकों के नेतृत्व में 21 से अधिक स्टार्टअप की सुविधा प्रदान की है। और यह संख्या हर साल बढ़ती जा रही है। यहाँ, मैं कस्तूरी हर्बल्स का उल्लेख करना चाहुँगी, जो 100% प्राकृतिक व्यक्तिगत देखभाल उत्पादों का एक संकाय-नेतृत्व वाला स्टार्टअप है। यह उद्यम पिछले एक साल में कुल 75 उत्पादों के साथ बड़े पैमाने पर विकसित हुआ है। उनके उत्पाद बच्चों, पुरुषों और महिलाओं की व्यक्तिगत देखभाल, औषधीय उत्पादों के अलावा पालतू जानवरों के लिए व्यक्तिगत देखभाल उत्पादों की ज़रूरतों को पूरा करते हैं। इस उद्यम ने राष्ट्रीय और अंतरराष्ट्रीय स्तर पर ध्यान आकर्षित किया है। पोलैंड के एक प्रोफेसर, जिन्होंने पहले इन उत्पादों का इस्तेमाल किया था, पिछले साल इनमें से कुछ उत्पादों को खरीदने के लिए विशेष रूप से हमारे कॉलेज में आए थे। वे प्रोफेसर मारिउज़ मिज़्टल, इतिहास के प्रोफेसर हैं, जो पोलैंड के क्राको में नेशनल एजुकेशन कमीशन विश्वविद्यालय में अंग्रेजी अध्ययन संस्थान के अध्यक्ष भी हैं। इस स्टार्टअप ने दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा आयोजित अंतर्राष्ट्रीय कौशल, स्टार्टअप और उद्यमिता प्रदर्शनी के दौरान भी बहुत रुचि पैदा की। कस्तुरी हर्बल्स कौशल संवर्धन पाठ्यक्रम 'केमेस्टी ऑफ कॉस्मेटिक्स' का परिणाम था। यहां मुझे यह भी बताना चाहिए कि हमारे कॉलेज को हमारे कौशल केंद्र अथर्वण के लिए दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा 15 लाख रुपये का अनुदान भी मंजूर किया गया है। बीए (प्रोग्राम) कंप्यूटर एप्लीकेशन की छात्रा इशिता ने एक स्टार्टअप, IYRA मीडिया बनाया, जिसे सिलिकॉन इंडिया मैगज़ीन ने '10 सर्वश्रेष्ठ इन्फ्लुएंसर मार्केटिंग स्टार्टअप 2024' के रूप में सूचीबद्ध किया। हमारी पूर्व छात्रा रिया अग्रवाल के स्टार्टअप, उन्मोदया फाउंडेशन के राइडिंग रेंजर्स को 4-6 सितंबर, 2024 को दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय द्वारा आयोजित अंतर्राष्ट्रीय कौशल, स्टार्टअप और उद्यमिता प्रदर्शनी में सर्वश्रेष्ठ इनोवेटर से सम्मानित किया गया। 2020 बैच की छात्रा जाह्नवी शर्मा ने कॉलेज में रहते हुए अपना स्टार्टअप स्टे-मेंटर तैयार किया। पिछले साल तक, उनके स्टार्टअप ने 564 बाहरी छात्राओं को आवास के लिए मदद की है। उन्होंने 1.8 लाख रुपये के लाभ के साथ 3 लाख रुपये का राजस्व उत्पन्न किया। हम यहां यह उल्लेख करना चाहते हैं कि हमारे संकाय सदस्य, वर्तमान छात्राएं और यहां तक कि हमारी पूर्व छात्राओं द्वारा किए गए उद्यम वास्तव में मैत्रेयी में स्टार्टअप पारिस्थितिकी तंत्र को समृद्ध करते हैं।

मैत्रेयी में बढ़ावा दिए गए नवाचार का लाभ न केवल इसकी उद्यमशीलता पहल और अकादिमक उत्कृष्टता में स्पष्ट है, बिल्क विभिन्न अन्य उपक्रमों में भी दिखाई देता है। इसका एक महत्वपूर्ण उदाहरण गार्डन कमेटी की पहल है। संकाय सदस्यों के मार्गदर्शन में छात्राओं ने कॉलेज परिसर में सभी पेड़ों और पौधों के लिए क्यूआर कोड बनाने का काम किया। इन क्यूआर कोड में प्रत्येक पेड़ और पौधे का विवरण होता है, जिससे पहचान करना आसान हो जाता है और कॉलेज की वनस्पतियों का डिजिटल डेटाबेस तैयार हो जाता है।

इसके अलावा, सेंटर फॉर रिसर्च ने समर इंटर्नशिप प्रोग्राम के दौरान 38 समर्पित संकाय सदस्यों की देखरेख में 83 छात्राओं को शोध परियोजनाओं में शामिल किया। एसआईपी 2023-24 का विषय था भारत में ज्ञान की प्रणालियाँ: आत्मिनर्भरता की ओर बढ़ना। इन सभी शोध पहलों को हमारे कॉलेज पुस्तकालय द्वारा पूरक किया जाता है जो सभी के लिए एक मूल्यवान संसाधन बना हुआ है। पिछले साल, पुस्तकालय ने अपनी डिजिटल उपस्थिति को बढ़ाया। वन नेशन वन सब्सक्रिप्शन (ONOS) और N-LIST कंसोर्टियम की सदस्यता ने वैश्विक शोध के साथ-साथ DU ई-लाइब्रेरी ई-संसाधनों तक पहुँच को भी सक्षम किया। इसके अलावा पुस्तकालय टर्निटिन और डिलिबट जैसे प्लेगियरिज्म चेक सॉफ्टवेयर के नवीनतम संस्करणों से सुसज्जित है। पिछले साल पुस्तकालय में एक बिल्कुल नया RFID सिस्टम भी स्थापित और लॉन्च किया गया था, जो विभिन्न प्रक्रियाओं को स्वचालित करता है। अनुभवात्मक शिक्षा का एक और पहलू पिछले साल की गई कई शैक्षिक यात्राओं के माध्यम से स्पष्ट होता है। विभिन्न विभागों द्वारा विभिन्न प्रयोगशालाओं, संग्रहालयों, गैर सरकारी संगठनों, ऐतिहासिक उत्खनन स्थलों, पारिस्थितिक संरक्षण सुविधाओं आदि के लिए 40 से अधिक फील्ड ट्रिप आयोजित किए गए, जिससे छात्रों को वास्तविक जीवन में सैद्धांतिक अवधारणाओं की प्रासंगिकता का अनुभव करने का अवसर मिला। इन यात्राओं ने कक्षा और उद्योग के बीच एक वास्तविक पुल का निर्माण किया।

#### रोजगार

कॉलेज में अनुसंधान और नवाचार के इस माहौल ने हमारी छात्राओं की रोजगार क्षमता में महत्वपूर्ण मील के पत्थर स्थापित किए। प्लेसमेंट ड्राइव एनविज़न के दौरान, विशेष रूप से इंटर्निशप के लिए 978 आवेदकों में से, 408 छात्रों को इंटर्निशप ऑफ़र मिले, जिसमें सबसे अधिक इंटर्निशप वजीफा 25000 रुपये था। और नौकरियों के लिए 201 आवेदकों में से 68 को सफलतापूर्वक प्लेसमेंट मिला। कॉलेज में नौकरी देने के लिए 45 कंपनियों और इंटर्निशप का ऑफ़र देने के लिए 118 कंपनियों का आना-जाना लगा रहा। ये संख्याएँ हमारी छात्राओं और शिक्षकों दोनों की गतिशीलता को दर्शाती हैं, जिनके प्रयास शिक्षण-सीखने की प्रक्रिया को इस फलदायी मोड़ पर ले जाते हैं, जहाँ हम अपनी छात्राओं को सफल कामकाजी पेशेवर बनते हुए देखते हैं।

#### समावेशिता

कॉलेज में की गई विभिन्न पहल समावेशिता के क्षेत्र में हमारे प्रयासों की ओर इशारा करती हैं, लेकिन मैं सिर्फ़ कुछ का ही ज़िक्र करूँगी। स्पेशल ओलंपिक भारत, एनजीओ क्योर इंडिया, रोटरी क्लब के साथ हमारे सहयोग से कॉलेज ने कई कार्यक्रम आयोजित किए। स्पेशल ओलंपिक भारत के साथ हमारा सहयोग एक ऐसा ही उदाहरण है। इसके तहत, पिछले साल जुलाई में, हमने स्वीडन में गोथिया कप में भाग लेने वाले भारतीय एथलीटों के लिए एक राष्ट्रीय फुटबॉल कोचिंग तैयारी प्रशिक्षण शिविर का आयोजन किया। हमने 46 पैरा-एथलीटों को कौशल, रणनीति और टीम वर्क में प्रशिक्षित किया। इसके अलावा, हमने नवंबर 2024 में संयुक्त रूप से स्पेशल ओलंपिक एशिया पैसिफिक क्षेत्रीय खेलों की मेजबानी की। इसमें 12 देशों की भागीदारी देखी गई। हमारे वार्षिक खेल दिवस 2025 पर, हमने विभिन्न प्रतियोगिताओं में |विभिन्न खेलों में पुरस्कार जीतने वाले दिव्यांग छात्रों को सम्मानित किया। यह एकीकृत खेलों को प्रोत्साहित करने के लिए कॉलेज द्वारा की गई एक पहल थी।

कॉलेज एनएसएस ने रोटारैक्ट क्लब ऑफ दिल्ली मिडटाउन मैत्रेयी के साथ मिलकर कई शिविर और कार्यक्रम आयोजित किए। एनएसएस ने नवोदित नामक एक उत्सव का भी आयोजन किया, जिसमें हमारे छात्रों द्वारा प्रशिक्षित वंचित स्कूली बच्चे विभिन्न गतिविधियों में भाग लेते हैं। इस कार्यक्रम में 2000 से अधिक बच्चों ने भाग

लिया। पिछले महीने हमारे एनएसएस छात्रों को विज्ञान भवन, नई दिल्ली में ज्ञानपीठ पुरस्कार 2025 के लिए स्वयंसेवकों के रूप में चुना गया था। यह पूरे मैत्रेयी समुदाय के लिए बहुत गर्व का क्षण था।

## बुनियादी ढांचा और गैर-शिक्षण कर्मचारी

पिछले वित्तीय वर्ष के दौरान, हमने कॉलेज पिरसर में 70 सीसीटीवी कैमरे लगाने से लेकर 25 ऑल-इन-वन कंप्यूटर, एक अत्याधुनिक इंटरैक्टिव पैनल, एक नई टिशू कल्चर प्रयोगशाला का निर्माण, एक नए रॉक गार्डन का विकास, एक आईजीएल गैस पाइपलाइन बिछाने, कॉलेज लाइब्रेरी में आरएफआईडी सिस्टम की स्थापना सिहत कई अन्य महत्वपूर्ण बुनियादी ढांचे का उन्नयन किया। यहाँ, मुझे इन सुविधाओं की खरीद और सफल कार्यान्वयन को सुविधाजनक बनाने में पूरे गैर-शिक्षण कर्मचारियों के प्रयासों को स्वीकार करना चाहिए। न केवल इस काम में, बिल्क हमारे गैर-शिक्षण कर्मचारी अन्य पहलों में भी अपनी सिक्रय भागीदारी से ख्याति प्राप्त करते हैं। उन्होंने डॉ. सिवता दत्ता मेमोरियल 5वें टी-20 क्रिकेट टूर्नामेंट में सभी कॉलेजों की क्रिकेट टीमों के खिलाफ जीत हासिल की। इसके अलावा, हमारे प्रशासनिक अधिकारी श्री रानू जी के नेतृत्व में कॉलेज की क्रिकेट टीम, जिसमें शिक्षण और गैर-शिक्षण दोनों कर्मचारी शामिल थे, डॉ. भीम राव अंबेडकर कॉलेज स्टाफ क्रिकेट टूर्नामेंट में उपविजेता रही। श्री अनिल छिल्लर (लैब अटेंडेंट, जूलॉजी विभाग) को दिल्ली विश्वविद्यालय स्टाफ क्लब टी-20 क्रिकेट टूर्नामेंट में सर्वश्रेष्ठ बल्लेबाज का पुरस्कार मिला।

प्रत्येक वर्ष, वार्षिक दिवस पर, जबिक हम अपनी उपलब्धियों का जश्न मनाते हैं, हम उन लोगों के योगदान को भी संजोने के लिए एक पल निकालते हैं जो पिछले एक साल में सेवानिवृत्त हुए हैं। प्रो. रंजना भट्टाचार्य, इतिहास विभाग, इस साल जनवरी में सेवानिवृत्त हुई। हम उनकी शैक्षणिक कठोरता को संजोते हैं और उनकी गायन की असाधारण प्रतिभा को नहीं भूलते। श्री हंस राज सकलानी, प्रयोगशालसहायक, रसायन विज्ञान विभाग ने भी इस वर्ष मार्च में हमारे साथ अपनी सेवा का कार्यकाल पूरा किया, जबिक श्री वीके राय, प्रयोगशाला सहायक, रसायन विज्ञान विभाग और श्रीमती मीना मल्होत्रा, तकनीकी सहायक, वनस्पति विज्ञान प्रयोगशाला ने पिछले साल दिसंबर में अपना कार्यकाल पूरा किया। श्री सकलानी जी, की सक्षम उपस्थिति के बिना प्रयोगशाला कार्य की बारीकियों को इतनी आसानी से निष्पादित नहीं किया जा सकता था। श्री राय और श्रीमती मल्होत्रा, हम उनके स्वास्थ्य और खुशहाली की कामना करते हैं, क्योंकि वे जीवन के एक और खुबसूरत चरण में प्रवेश कर रहे हैं।

हमारी उपलब्धियाँ जारी रहने के साथ, मैं अब अपना भाषण समाप्त करती हूँ। मुझे उम्मीद है कि शैक्षणिक विशिष्टता, नवाचार और समग्र विकास की परंपरा हम सभी को प्रेरित करती रहेगी और हम हर साल नई उपलब्धियाँ हासिल करेंगे। मैं वार्षिक रिपोर्ट संकलित करने में IQAC सिमित की कड़ी मेहनत, छात्र संघ संयोजकों और उनकी पूरी टीम, सभी कॉलेज सिमितियों के संयोजकों, सदस्यों और गैर-शिक्षण कर्मचारियों के अथक प्रयासों के लिए धन्यवाद देती हूँ। पूरे वर्ष हमारे कॉलेज में NCWEB और SOL केंद्रों के सुचारू संचालन में उनके योगदान के लिए शिक्षण और गैर-शिक्षण कर्मचारियों को भी धन्यवाद। हमारे सामूहिक प्रयासों ने इस शैक्षणिक वर्ष के सफल समापन को सुनिश्चित किया है! मैं निम्नलिखित कुछ पंक्तिओं के साथ अपनी बात समाप्त करना चाहूँगी।

#### 3. COLLEGE ACTIVITIES

#### 3.1. DEPARTMENTS

#### DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

The academic session of the Department of Botany commenced with an Orientation Programme held on 29th August, 2024, for the newly admitted students of B.Sc. (Hons.) Botany, First Year. The Botanical Society began the academic year with the organisation of 'Blossom Election 2024' on 11th September 2024 to select the office bearers. A session on "Resume Building and LinkedIn Essentials" was conducted on 15th October, 2024, by Mr. Jay Datta. An 'Alumni Interaction Seminar' was held on 6th November, 2024, featuring Ms. Shweta Tiwari (Batch 2019-22), currently a Research Analyst at S&P Global. The department's Annual Cultural Fest 'Pallav 2025', held on 24th March, 2025, was a vibrant celebration featuring a variety of student performances and competitive events. An outreach event titled "Floral-Escapades" was coordinated from February to March 2025 as part of 'Avgaahan'. A significant highlight of the academic year was the "International Symposium on Genes in Health and Agriculture", conducted on 15th April, 2025. The academic year concluded with the Farewell of B.Sc. (Hons.) Botany students organised on 21st April, 2025. Students' educational visits were planned, including Aravali Biodiversity Park (18th September, 2024), Yamuna Biodiversity Park (09th October, 2024), Nehru Park (16th November, 2024), District Park (22nd March, 2025), National Bureau of Plant Genetic Resources (18th February, 2025), BioNest Facility (05th March, 2025), Sunder Nursery (22nd March, 2025), and CCUBGA, ICAR (26th March, 2025).

Under the auspices of the Skill Enhancement Centre of the college, Atharvan, the Department of Botany has launched the skill centre 'Hareetika (Padap Sanrakshan/Paryavarniya Chetna)'. The 'Mushroom Cultivation Facility', established in July 2023 for the cultivation of mushrooms on a small scale, is currently being used to cultivate several mushroom species. To support button mushroom production, a composting pit has been developed and is actively being used to standardise compost preparation methodologies. A start-up initiative known as 'Chatraka: The Mushroom Haven' has been started to explore the entrepreneurial aspects. The 'Hydroponics and Aeroponic Farming' has been established as a skill centre aimed to provide hands-on experience to students on various aspects of hydroponics and aeroponics. Another skill centre, the Plant Tissue Culture (PTC) facility, 'Kritrim: Life in Glass', is aimed at comprehending the principles and applications of tissue culture in plants. The Department of Botany has established an excellent setup, 'Urvara', for the preparation of premium-quality bio-compost. Recently, a new division of vermi-composting has been started for the preparation of a quality-tested superlative mixture using green waste. 'Gulistan' is a skill-based start-up initiative for students under the aegis of the Garden Committee, Maitreyi College, aimed at capturing the natural beauty of flowers and incorporating them into aesthetic products, accessories, and stationery items.

#### **DEPARTMENT OF CHEMISTRY**

The Department of Chemistry experienced yet another enriching academic year marked by a vibrant blend of educational achievements, skill development and co-curricular engagement. The educational session commenced with the Orientation Programme on 29th August, 2024, designed to welcome the newly admitted students. Faculty members introduced the departmental framework, course structure, laboratory protocols, and co-curricular activities, helping students transition smoothly into college life. In its pursuit of nurturing professional growth and career

clarity, an **inspirational session** titled 'Foundation for Success' was organised by Ms. Monica Dhawan from Wipro on 11th September, 2024. The session equipped students with tools for goal setting, visionary thinking, and impactful communication. The session was followed by departmental elections, promoting leadership and the spirit of responsibility among students. A **specialised lecture** titled "Basics of Protein Folding: In-Cell Insights" by Prof. Parmit K. Chowdhury from IIT Delhi was organised on 19th February, 2024, providing valuable insights into the role of protein structures in biological functions and disease mechanisms, sparking active student engagement and interest in biochemical research. A **Career Counselling Workshop** was conducted on March 6 by renowned career strategist Mr. Jitin Chawla to offer guidance on higher education opportunities abroad, emerging career fields, and global employment trends. The academic year culminated in the Annual Departmental Fest **CHEMSOPHY'25** on 28th March, 2025, a vibrant confluence of intellectual rigour and creative expression that drew enthusiastic participation from across the University, fostering scientific curiosity and a collaborative spirit.

As part of their academic exposure and experiential learning, students in the B.Sc. (Hons.) The chemistry program visited the CSIR-National Physical Laboratory (NPL) to gain insights into advanced scientific research. They also attended an interactive career counselling session at Shiv Nadar University, which provided exposure to academic opportunities. Additionally, students visited the Rail Neer Water Plant, gaining practical exposure to water purification, quality control, and industrial-scale processing. To advance skill-based education and foster an innovative and entrepreneurial mindset among students, the department inaugurated its Skill Centre, *Srijan*, featuring two key verticals: Kasturi Herbals, dedicated to crafting handmade herbal cosmetics, and a Food Lab aimed at promoting healthy, sustainable food choices. The year witnessed notable faculty accomplishments, including multiple research publications and a patent, reflecting the department's unwavering commitment to academic excellence and innovation.

#### **DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE**

The academic year 2024–25 marked a hallmark of innovation, learning, and student engagement for the Department of Commerce at Maitreyi College. The session began with an Excel Webinar and Commerce Department Orientation, fostering early skill-building and camaraderie. A vibrant Teachers' Day celebration further strengthened the student-faculty bond. A wide range of seminars and webinars provided students with practical insights. Key sessions included Excel training, CAT preparation, OTT content & marketing, career guidance in finance and accounting, and comprehensive information on study-abroad opportunities. These initiatives aimed to enhance both academic understanding and global career readiness. The department also organised a Faculty Development Programme on 'Management Accounting using Spreadsheets' and a two-day ICSSR (received a grant of Rs. 2,50,000/-) and PNB-sponsored National Conference on 'Viksit Bharat 2047,' which explored the impact of AI on business and management. Excelsior also celebrated its 10th anniversary and hosted "Grad Guide: The Alumni Tales," where alumni shared valuable career experiences. Excelsior's signature events—Market Rajneeti and COMFESCO'25—challenged students through creative marketing and commerce contests, while AVGAHAN 2025 showcased global academic talent in diverse competitions.

Faculty achievements were a cornerstone of the year. Dr. Sonal Babbar and Ms. Kritika Khurana, co-founders of the mobile app UniWay Maitreyi: Future Unleashed, served as resource persons on "Taxability of Ecommerce' at Shyam Lal College and co-authored a textbook on 'Goods and Services Tax' for undergraduate students. They published research paper titled "Journey to the center of the pension world in India: From OPS to NPS to UPS" in Samikhiya and "Optimizing the

Consumption of Products in Petroleum Industry: An Approach towards Agricultural Sustainability" published in Effulgence: A Bi-Annual peer reviewed publication of RDIAS". Ms. Kritika Khurana, along with students, won the Best Paper Award at the National Conference "Viksit Bharat 2047" titled "Sticking to Success: Fevicol's Journey of Bonding Innovation, Sustainability, and AI-Driven Global Transformation." Dr. Vidisha Garg co-authored Management Accounting with Excel Applications (Taxmann Publications, 2024). Additionally, Ms. Reena mentored three students in a SIP project titled "Defence sector and India's quest towards self-reliance: A study on Make in India and Atmanirbhar Bharat Initiative" in 2024.

#### DEPARTMENT OF COMPUTER SCIENCE

Department of Computer Science, in collaboration with the Enabling Unit of Maitreyi College, signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with CURE India for the development of the Canary App, designed for indoor navigation. Students from the department participated in this initiative for older people and specially abled, which was launched at the Pandit Deendayal Upadhyaya National Institute for Persons with Physical Disabilities (PDUNIPPD) on 1st October, 2024. A two-day Faculty Training Program (FTP) on 'Google tools' was organised on 25-26th September, 2024, by Dr. Manju Bhardwaj and Ms. Rupali Ahuja, wherein all the teachers of the department acted as resource persons. Twenty-nine college teachers enrolled for the FTP. Additionally, a 30-hour certificate course on Python Programming was conducted by Dr. Veena Ghuriani and Dr. Shweta Sankhwar from 15-24th January, 2025, which witnessed the participation of 13 college students/research scholars across the university. Dr Veena Ghuriani convened Avgaahan 2025, the International Interdisciplinary Academic Fest for the entire college. The department participated in Avgaahan with the **TechWiz IT Quiz** and the Web-a-Thon events. Other initiatives included a National Cyber Security Awareness Quiz on 1st November, 2024, coordinated by Dr. Shikha Badhani and Dr. Shweta Sankhwar; a visit to Amrit Udyaan in Rashtrapati Bhavan on 27th March, 2025; and CIENCIA student fest organised by Ilustrado, the student society on 26th March, 2025 which witnessed participation of 56 students from other colleges.

Under the aegis of *Atharvan*, Dr. Shikha Badhani, at Maitreyi College, conducted IoT workshops, a logo design competition, and a short video competition for SEC (Skill Enhancement Courses). Additionally, she co-convened a one-week online National Faculty Development Programme (FDP) titled "Reinventing Pedagogy in the Age of AI: Methods, Approaches, and Perspectives," organised in collaboration with UGC-MMTTC, SGTB Khalsa College (DU) in January, 2025. Dr. Shweta Sankhwar served as an organising member for this FDP, which was attended by 100 faculty members from across the country.

#### DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

The Economics Association of Maitreyi College - **Arthaneeti** began the academic year with the Council Elections on 23rd September, 2024, where students were democratically elected to leadership roles, setting the stage for an active year of engagement. Celebrations kicked off with the Diwali Event on 25th October, 2024, featuring fun games like the 'Guess the Song Challenge,' which encouraged student participation and bonding. Academic enrichment was followed by multiple impactful speaker sessions. Prof. Praveen Jha, **from the Centre for Economic Studies and Planning (CESP)**, **JNU**, **spoke on 'Contemporary Global Value Systems' on 11th November 2024**. Prof. Jayati Ghosh, The **Massachusetts Institute of Technology (MIT)**, **USA**, delivered a session

titled "Trump: A Disruptor of the Global Economy" (7th February, 2025), analysing global trade dynamics.

In the "Ecologue" Fresher's Debate (12th November, 2024), first-year students participated in an article writing competition and a live debate on topics such as Indian weddings. The Republic Day Event (25th January, 2025) included a quiz and poster competition on the national economy and symbols. Skill development was a focus through the Advanced Excel Workshop (15th January, 2025), led by Prof. Amlesh Kanekar, and a Career Counselling Seminar (25th February, 2025) by Faisal Khan, which discussed jobs, upskilling, and global education opportunities. The Study Abroad Webinar (29th January, 2025) offered guidance on university selection, SOP writing, and scholarships. The annual fest **Ekonomiska 2025** (25–26th March, 2025) showcased diverse academic contests, including Ekonoclash (Debate), Paper Presentation, Neeti Nirmaan (Policy Simulation), Madvertising (Marketing with humour), and Trade Wars (Mock trading simulation). The year concluded with a heartfelt Farewell Ceremony for the graduating batch, along with the launch of the departmental magazine **NEETI**.

#### **DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH**

The Department of English and Dhiti organised various events to inculcate critical thinking among the students through *Dhiti*, the literary association of the English department. The academic session commenced with the Orientation Program, which welcomed the first-year students. Students were introduced to the curriculum and informed about the department, as well as the types of activities conducted in the past. #### DEPARTMENT OF ENVIRONMENTAL SCIENCE

The Department of Environmental Science had a vibrant and impactful academic year 2024–25, marked by active student participation, faculty achievements, and meaningful collaborations. A major highlight was the **poster-making competition** organised to commemorate the **International Day for Disaster Risk Reduction**. On 17th February, 2025, an archaeological visit to Kurdi, Baghpat (U.P.), for the third-year students was also organised. On 5th March, 2025, a visit was organised to the Red Fort Complex for the B.A. (P) students. On 20th March, 2025, we hosted an enlightening lecture on the topic "**History's Past and Present**," delivered by the esteemed Professor Harbans Mukhia. On 22nd March, 2025, a visit was arranged for the SEC 'Museum And Museology' students to the **National** 

Museum, the National Crafts Museum and the Hastkala Academy and on 25th March, 2025, a visit was organised to Pradhan Mantri Sangrahalaya for all the students of the department. Our annual academic fest, based on the theme of 'Conglomeration Of Northeastern Diversity', "Purvayan'25" took place on 02nd April, 2025, where the second edition of our annual magazine 'Kathavarnan' was also launched. It was followed by a lecture by esteemed Dr. David Vumlallian Zou, who spoke on the Northeastern narratives, where we received participants from different colleges and universities. The department also screened 'Seven Brides For Seven Brothers' on 03rd April, 2025, and an educational visit to the Indira Gandhi Memorial for the students of SEC (Museum And Museology) on 12th April, 2025. #### **DEPARTMENT OF MATHEMATICS**

The Department of Mathematics at Maitreyi College actively fostered intellectual growth through diverse initiatives in the 2024-25 academic year. The year commenced with a seminar on compassion and service by Ms. Seema Charla on 27th August, 2024. The department conducted an orientation program for first-year students, titled 'Know My Department,' on 29th August, 2024, which detailed the curriculum and class schedule. Sutra Scribbles encouraged creative expression through a Vedic Mathematics writing contest on 05th September, 2024. The student representative elections of the Mathematical Society, Gradient, took place on 17th September, 2024, promoting the importance of voting. On 18th September, 2024, Prof. Shanta Laishram led a seminar on 'Number Theory and Cryptography, exploring modern encryption'. The screening of 'N is a Number' on 15th October, 2024 offered insights into Paul Erdős' life. A Vedic Mathematics Workshop, held on 19th November, 2024, highlighted ancient techniques. The 'National Mathematics Day', in honour of renowned Indian Mathematician Srinivasa Ramanujan, was celebrated on 22nd December, 2024 with Poster Making and Article Writing Competitions, and Quiz Quest. The department hosted a seminar on 'AI-Powered Career Success' by Ms. Megha Khetarpaal on 18th February, 2025. On 24th February, 2025, the seminar "From Concepts to Fashion Campaigns" by Ms. Madhumita Ghosh explored the role of mathematical concepts in the creative industries. Mr. Rohan Lakhne led two workshops on 'Emerging Global Trends in Education and Job Markets', on 26th March, 2025 and 15th April, 2025. The annual departmental fest, ABSCISSA, held on 27th March, 2025, featured an Inaugural Talk by Prof. Sivananthan Sampath and events such as paper presentations and 'Think Inside the Box'. A webinar, 'Some Peculiar Properties of Cantor Set', was held on 22nd April, 2025 under a memorandum of understanding (MoU) with MBGPG College, Uttarakhand. The year concluded with a Farewell Party for the graduating batch on 22nd April, 2025, extending best wishes for their future endeavours.

#### **DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS**

The Department of Physics undertook a dynamic array of academic and research-focused initiatives. The session commenced with an **orientation programme** on 27th August, 2024, followed by an interactive session titled **'Know My Department'** to introduce first-year students to NEP 2020 and the department's ethos. Notable faculty achievements included the conferment of Ph.D. degrees to Dr. Rinku and Dr. Bharti Rohilla, and the selection of Dr. Prajwalit Shikha to the **Executive Council of IAPT, RC1 (2025–27)**. The department earned accolades at Equinox 2024, winning first prize in the science stream for a Piezoelectric Energy Harvesting Model under the mentorship of Prof. Ritu Dhingra and Dr. Prajwalit Shikha. A significant milestone was the signing of an industry-academia **MoU with Singrid** to provide students with enhanced industrial

exposure. Faculty members contributed significantly to research, publishing 11 papers in UGC-listed journals, 9 in international peer-reviewed journals and authoring five book chapters. The Department hosted the 8th Dr. Savita Datta Memorial Lecture, where Prof. Sanjay Singh delivered an insightful talk on reforms in higher education. A significant step towards skill enhancement was the launch of the Daksha-Skill Development Centre, aimed at promoting practical, hands-on learning. Career guidance was offered through a session with DRISHTI IAS titled 'Mastering UPSC: College Edition.' The annual fest, QUEST'25, began with a lecture on optical communication and featured various inter-college competitions. A workshop on Product design using Arduino introduced students to electronic designs. To celebrate National Science Day, students visited IUAC, participating in informative lectures, interactive demonstrations and a guided tour of research facilities. The department successfully conducted a 30-hour certificate course on 'Product Designing with Arduino'. AKASHGANGA -The Astronomy Club was inaugurated with an international webinar by Prof. Poshak Gandhi (U.K.) on black holes.

#### **DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICAL EDUCATION**

Maitreyi College continues to uphold its strong tradition of sports excellence during the academic session 2024-2025. Students actively participated and excelled at various levels — National, Inter-University, Inter-College, State, and Inter-Departmental — across a wide range of sports and games. Our athletes represented the college in events such as Athletics, Boxing, Judo, Kho-Kho, Netball, Powerlifting, Softball, Taekwondo, Volleyball, Wrestling, and Weightlifting, bringing numerous laurels and enhancing the college's reputation for sporting excellence. For which our softball and weightlifting team, and netball players Khushi Singh and Sakshi Singh were awarded in the **Delhi University sports awards ceremony** on 7th May, 2025. Faculty members represented the college internationally and on the national level; Ms. Shipra Verma was part of the Kho-Kho World Cup organising team. And also the team manager of the Indian cycling team at Almaty, Kazakhstan; whilst Dr. Neha Baghel has successfully finished 5 km sea swimming in Arabian sea in 1 hour 30 minutes at 21st rank at National level and also won four medals: 1 gold, one silver and two bronze in 20th Master's National Swimming Championship held in Bhopal. Our students also represented the college in various events, such as inter-university tournaments, inter-college tournaments, as well as going ahead and taking part in inter-departmental activities; Komal, Prema, Diksha, Preeti (Softball inter-university), Neha Bisht (North Zone inter-University hockey, Anushka Singh Kushwaha and Neha Rathee (North Zone University football). Sakshi Singh and Khushi Singh (North Zone University Netball). Tanvi Singh (North Zone University basketball). The Sports department actively collaborated with the Special Olympics Bharat (SOB) team. Events such as the Special Olympics Asia Pacific Regional Games, the SOB National Football Coaching Preparatory Camp, the State Basketball Championship, the Special Olympic Bocce State Championship, and the **RUN FOR INCLUSION** were organised under SOB.

The sports department also conducted a **Women's Football Development Program**, a 6-day international football development program supported by the **Embassy of the Federal Republic of Germany**, **Head Coach Klaus Pabst from Köln, Germany**. This year, we participated in various community events, including the District Interact Leadership Assembly on 5<sup>th</sup> November, 2024, the **Fit India Program** from 4 to 10th December, 2024, the **Pink Cyclothon** 2025 on 8–9th March, 2025, the "**One Nation, One Election**" Event Held at Delhi University on 30th April, 2025, and the **Sunday Cyclathon** for teachers on 04th May, 2025. We hosted the **6th Annual Sports Festival** "**AGAAZ'25"** from 27th to 29th March, 2025. This prestigious inter-college tournament welcomed participation from over 1000 students across Delhi University and the NCR region. AGAAZ'25

showcased a wide range of competitive events, including Athletics, Tug of War, Kho-Kho, Basketball, and Football. The 2024-2025 session has been yet another year of remarkable achievements and enthusiastic participation in sports for Maitreyi College.

#### DEPARTMENT OF POLITICAL SCIENCE

The Department of Political Science at Maitreyi College sustained a vibrant academic and cocurricular presence in 2024-25 through seminars, webinars, field visits, and student-led activities under Res Publica, fostering critical thinking, civic engagement, and participatory learning. The year began with a training programme on constitutional values in collaboration with the Institute of Constitutional and Parliamentary Studies, inaugurated by Member of Parliament Mr. Praveen Khandelwal. Orientation for first-year students was followed by key academic events, including an international webinar on the global rise of the far right by **Prof.** Javier Sajuria (Queen Mary University, London), and a career session with the Indian School of Development Management on opportunities in the development sector. The annual fest, Dharohar'25, included poster-making and extempore competitions on the theme "Vision 2047: India at 100 Years of Republic," drawing wide participation from across the University of Delhi. Experiential learning was deepened through educational visits to Parliament (featuring interactions with Justice Hima Kohli and Shri Ravi Shankar Prasad), the National Human Rights Commission, the Indira Gandhi Memorial Museum, the Pradhanmantri Sangrahalaya, and the Dr. Ambedkar International Centre on Constitution Day. Topical seminars explored military diplomacy, globalisation, digital intermediary liability, and tariff politics, featuring voices from academia, policy, and media, including Ms Shreya Business Standard. Student initiatives like Vaad Vaadika (mock parliament) promoted debate and public speaking. The academic year culminated in the flagship fest Vox Populi'25, themed "Clicks, Posts, Protests: The Power of Social Media in Political Discourse," underscoring the department's ongoing commitment to inquiry, dialogue, and democratic values.

#### **DEPARTMENT OF PUNJABI**

The Department of Punjabi organised various activities, events, and programs throughout the year 2024-2025 to enhance the Indian values, knowledge and creative skills of the students. On 30th August, 2024, the Orientation Programme was organised for first-year students to provide information about academic and other departmental activities. The department organised an Intra-College Poster making competition on the topic 'Gurumukhi Lippi, Prasidh Punjabi Sahitkaar and Punjabi Sabhiyachar' on 26th September, 2024. It provided opportunities for students to develop and showcase different artistic possibilities. The department organised a dialogue on 'Punjabi Cinema: Past, Present and Future'. It opened a new worldview to students about Punjabi Cinema, which has made a lot of progress in contemporary times and has created a unique identity in worldwide cinema. Further, the department organised a movie screening of the Punjabi Film 'Sheed E Mohbbat Buta Singh' on 20th November 2024. It conveyed memorable information about the partition times and different aspects of Punjabi society and culture to students. The department organised a poster-making competition with the theme 'Young Lives Big Sacrifices' on Veer Bal Diwas in memory of the symbols of courage and heroism of Sahibzada Zorawar Singh ji and Sahibzada Fateh Singh ji, and a book exhibition was organised in the Library of Maitreyi College. It provided information and valuable knowledge to students about the journey of martyrdom in Sikh history. On the same day, the department organised a short educational trip for some students. On 31st January, 2025, under the Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), the department organised 'Hunar Pachann: Sirjanatmak lekhan and Anuvaad kala' by some

students. The department celebrated **Matr-Bhasha Diwas** with Raj Bhasha Prakoshth on 24th February, 2025, in which students presented various performances in the Punjabi language by themselves. The Annual Inter-College Punjabi Fest **PHULKARI**, dated 26th March, 2025, was celebrated with events like Akharkari mukabla and Punjabi Folk dance. The Wall magazine was also prepared by the students of the department. Bhumika Kamboj (B.A. Prog. 2nd year) was awarded as All Rounder student.

#### **DEPARTMENT OF SANSKRIT**

The Department of Sanskrit celebrated Sanskrit Week by organising a National Lecture along with various Sanskrit-related activities on 21st August, 2024. A distinguished lecture on the topic "Bhāratīya-Jñāna-Paramparāyāḥ Vaiśvikapariḍrśyam" was delivered, attracting the participation of 96 attendees. In collaboration with the Enabling Unit, Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC), and the Maharshi Patanjali Skill Enhancement Centre (MPSEC), the Department of Sanskrit hosted a National Lecture titled "Exploring Procedural Parallels between Sanskrit Grammar and Artificial Intelligence" on 09th September, 2024. The event witnessed an enthusiastic response with 173 participants. On the same day, another National Lecture was organised in collaboration with the Enabling Unit, EOC, and MPSEC on the theme "Preraṇāpuñja Maitreyi," also attended by 173 participants. The Department, in association with the School of Indic Studies, Institute of Advanced Sciences, USA, and the Council of Indic Studies & Research (CISR), New Delhi, hosted the Fourth International Sanskrit Conference (ISC). The conference focused on the theme "Exploring Literary and Scientific Perspectives in Cosmology". Scholars from India, the USA, and Georgia presented fifty high-quality research papers. Twelve eminent scholars were felicitated for their outstanding contributions to promoting Sanskrit and Indic Studies globally. The Department organised its annual festival Vagartha on 09th April, 2025. On this occasion, a special lecture on "Bhāratīya Samskṛti mem Navarātra Māhātmya" was conducted, with 106 participants in attendance. Additionally, three vibrant competitions were held: Prashnamañch Pratiyogita, Mantrapāṭha Pratiyogita, and Chitrakarma Pratiyogita. Besides these, the Sanskrit Parishad organised a series of activities, including Gadyapātha Pratiyogita, Rāmāyana-Mahābhārata-Purāṇa-based Praśnamañch Pratiyogita, as well as welcoming (Freshers) and farewell functions.

#### **DEPARTMENT OF SOCIOLOGY**

The Department of Sociology organised a diverse range of events throughout the academic year. The session began with an orientation and student elections, followed by a declamation contest conducted by Manan, the Centre for Gandhian Studies. A cleanliness drive was also held under the Swachh Bharat Abhiyan. To foster cultural engagement, the department screened the film 'Kantara' for students. Several webinars and seminars were conducted in collaboration with Prepp IAS, Chahal IAS Academy, and Drishti IAS, focusing on civil services preparation and academic development. Additionally, fundraising events were organised in partnership with institutions such as Pahuja Law Academy and others. The department also arranged a visit to the Student Education Fair with SI-Global, and a workshop with SI-UK on 10th October, 2024, to guide students on pursuing higher education in the UK. On 25th January, 2025, an open seminar on competitive exams was held with Drishti IAS. The department also took part in the college's interdisciplinary fest Avgaahan with the theme 'Desi Tales: Mano Ya Na Mano' and hosted its annual fest, Imagine, on the theme "Lok-Utsav:

Exploring Many Indias." Dr. Anurita Jalan has been invited to serve as a reviewer for the *Indian* Journal of Gender Studies and the journal Asian Ethnicity, published by Taylor & Francis, a division of Routledge, UK. Dr. Gopi D. Tripathy published a chapter titled "Women as Martyrs: Palestinian Women's Country on the Nakba" in the book "Gendered Transformative Initiatives in South Asia," published by Routledge India. She also presented a paper titled "Daughters of Catastrophe: Literary Testimonies from Palestine" at an international conference organised by the Department of Sociology, Miranda House, on 11th April, 2025. Additionally, she published an editorial titled "Fullness of India: Word, World & People" in the Vantage Journal of Thematic Analysis in October, 2024. Dr. Aruna Grover mentored two students for the Summer Internship Programme (SIP), who secured the second prize for their presentation at Equinox 2024, the Annual International conference organised by the Centre for Research, Maitreyi College. Dr. Babita Choudhary presented a joint paper on "Empowering Women Entrepreneurs: The Role of Digital Technology in Kashmir" at the All India Sociological Conference, 2024 (BML University, Gurugram). She published an article titled "Mahakumbh: Sacred Togetherness in the World's Largest Gathering" in the newspaper "The Pioneer". Her research article "The Struggle of Working Women in India's Social Landscape" was published in a UGC-CARE Group journal. She was invited as a Guest speaker at Subharti University under the 'Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat' initiative. Dr. Bijayani Mishra was invited to deliver a talk at the ICSSR-sponsored two-day National Seminar on "Changing Role of Academic Libraries and Literature in the Light of NEP-2020", organised by the Department of Library and Information Science and the Department of English, Sparsh Himalayan University, Dehradun, on 30-31st August, 2024. #### **DEPARTMENT OF ZOOLOGY**

The Department of Zoology at Maitreyi College had an enriching and eventful academic year in 2024-25, marked by significant achievements and active participation from both students and teaching and non-teaching staff. The year began with an engaging Orientation Session and "Know My Department", introducing first-year students to the department's ethos and activities, along with a brief discussion of SEC papers offered by other departments. The Zoological Society, Chrysalis, organised a variety of events promoting scientific thinking, environmental awareness, and skill development. Distinguished speakers included Ms. Divya Shah (Co-Founder of Happify U) on mental well-being, Prof. Gajendra P.S. Raghava (IIIT Delhi) on bioinformatics, Dr. Yogita K. Adlakha on molecular neuroscience, and Dr. Poorthi Kathpalia on science storytelling. Key events included Teacher's Day celebrations, career counselling by Dr. Lalita Choudhary, and a departmental fest 'Zoophoria' featuring Dr. Gaurav Bahodia's talk on snakes. The annual intercollege fest in March 2025 witnessed enthusiastic participation in SciQuiz, Just-A-Minute, Poster Presentations, and "Nature through Lens". Students excelled in intercollegiate competitions. The academic year included notable student achievements: Shreyanshee Vaidya and Manya Sharma (2nd Year), who held leadership roles in Chrysalis and earned accolades in presentations and contests; Lyra Singh, showcased excellence in event organisation, content, and design; and Sweety and Antima Singh, who actively volunteered in seminars, quizzes, and fests. Himanjani Sharma earned accolades in shooting, including 2nd position in the Delhi State Championship. Anushka Tripathi (3rd Year) served as Event Coordinator Head for the NEPAL FESTIVAL 2025, and interned with NGOs. Jagriti Sharma served as an enthusiastic volunteer and active participant in environmental, academic, and creative initiatives, contributing to events organised by WWF India and Bird Count India. Educational trips to the National Zoological Park and Sericulture Centre provided valuable hands-on learning experiences to students. Faculty achievements included Dr. Archana Aggarwal's commissioning as Lt. (Dr.) Archana Aggarwal successfully completed the OTA Gwalior Pre-Commission Course. Dr. Avanish Kumar Shrivastav and Anil Chhillar (Lab Staff) contributed to the Maitreyi College Cricket Team's success as Runners-up in the Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar College Staff Cricket Tournament and winners of the Dr. Savita Datta Memorial T-20 Tournament. All faculty members also made significant contributions through their active involvement in departmental activities, workshops, conferences, and by publishing research papers in reputable journals and contributing book chapters to edited books. The department bid farewell to the graduating class of 2024–2025 on April 17, 2025, and also honoured Museum Curator Meena Ji on her retirement. Throughout the year, the department fostered creativity, analytical thinking, and engagement, making science both accessible and enjoyable for all students.

#### 3.2. LIBRARY

The Maitreyi College Library has made significant strides in enhancing its collection, services, and infrastructure during the academic year 2024-2025. The library has augmented its collection to

102761. The library acquired 1255 new books during this session, 2024-2025. Additionally, the library subscribed to 51 journals, including popular magazines and 16 newspapers (23 copies). The library has also enhanced its digital presence by: Continuing its membership with DELNET (Developing Library Network); accessing of Institutional repository using DSpace software on the intranet; Subscribing to One Nation One Subscription (ONOS) and N-LIST consortium, providing access to global research as well as duelibrary e-resources; Plagiarism checking software facility in the light of research ethics by Turnitin and Drillbit software. The library has upgraded its infrastructure to support the growing needs of its users. It has: acquired a new HP Laserjet printer; purchased a new lamination machine to support library operations, including the lamination of library membership cards and other materials; installed 15 new UPS systems; two new parallel monitors has installed at the circulation counter to enhance transparency and accountability of library transactions (issue/return of books, fine, book overdue status); and installed 20 metal shelving racks to optimise storage and accessibility.

The library organised various programmes to promote information literacy, library services, and facilities among students and faculty members. **Orientation programme** at the beginning of the academic session 2024-2025 to introduce new students to the library services and facilities. Two hundred twenty-seven participants participated in this programme. On the birth anniversary of Padma Shri Dr. S.R. #### **AVGAAHAN**

Avgaahan, the International Interdisciplinary Annual Academic Festival, provides a platform for undergraduate students to participate in a variety of online competitions that span multiple disciplines. Every department comes up in innovative online competitions in the form of

preliminary and final rounds for students across the globe. Avgaahan was organised from 06th February to 06th March, 2025. The departments of the college floated various online competitions like quiz, caricature making, Web-a-Thon, Slogan Writing, photography, and many more. The official launch of the poster of Avgaahan 2025 was done by Prof. Haritma Chopra, Principal, Maitreyi College, on 06th February, 2025. This year, a total of 3246 students registered for the various competitions, giving a flying start to the event. The preliminary rounds were organised from 19th to 21st January, 2025, where 1628 students participated in multiple competitions. The final rounds were organised from 27th February to 01st March, 2025. Five hundred six students were shortlisted, and 387 students participated in the final rounds. The results were announced on 06th March, 2025, on the college website. The winners were awarded with e-certificates and cash prizes. The seventh edition of Avgaahan saw successful conduct of a webinars on 20th February, 2025 in collaboration with Chanakya IAS Academy on the topics "Good Governance Vs Ethical Governance" and "Role of AI in Governance" and another seminar on "Q&A for MBA Entrance Exam" on 25th February, 2025 in collaboration with Career Launcher. With the unconditional support of all students and department coordinators, the seventh edition of Avgaahan culminated efficiently.

# CENTRE FOR RESEARCH (CFR) AND ADVISORY COMMITTEE FOR PROFESSIONAL GROOMING (ACPG)

The Centre for Research (CFR), in collaboration with the Advisory Committee for Professional Grooming (ACPG), remains steadfast in its commitment to nurturing a robust research culture among students and faculty. As part of the Summer Internship Programme (SIP) 2023-24, a total of 27 internship projects were completed between May and July 2024. These included seven projects in the sciences and 20 in the social sciences, mathematics, and humanities. The internships engaged 83 students under the mentorship of 38 dedicated faculty members. The thematic focus for SIP 2023-24 was "Systems of Knowledge in India: Moving Towards Self-Reliance." Under the Annual Research Programme (ARP), research proposals were invited in July 2024. Following due screening, three research projects were approved, involving eight faculty members and fifteen students, reflecting an encouraging spirit of inquiry and collaboration. Under the Vocal for Local initiative, which supports projects centred around campus mapping, institutional documentation, and localised research, one project has been approved. This initiative aims to deepen the understanding of the college's evolving academic and cultural spaces. Under the aegis of Vantage: Journal of Thematic Analysis, CFR hosted its annual international conference Equinox 2024, from 04th -06th September, 2024, on the theme 'System of Knowledge in India: Moving Towards Self-Reliance'. The Chief Guest of the event was Prof. Yogesh Singh (Vice Chancellor, University of Delhi), and the Guest of Honour was Prof. Bhushan Patwardhan (National Research Professor in Ayush). The highlight of inaugural session was the release of the book "Genome to Om: Evolving Journey of Modern Science to Meta-science" authored by Prof. Patwardhan, which was followed by panel discussion by eminent panelists. The release of the book was accompanied by a soulful music composition by renowned music composer Shankar Mahadevan and dance by Swaroopa Utgi Classical Dance Co. The conference attracted 357 registered participants and showcased 54 scholarly paper presentations, making it a landmark event in CFR's academic calendar. A new and promising initiative of CFR, the Prashikshuta Programme, was launched to enable college faculty to mentor students from other institutions in internships and dissertation projects. In its inaugural phase, eight internships were successfully undertaken, marking a strong start to this inter-institutional academic exchange. To promote experiential learning, CFR and ACPG regularly organise educational excursions for

students. These journeys are designed to foster independent thinking, creativity, collaboration, and cultural awareness. In the academic year 2024-25, students from eight departments participated in such excursions to various enriching destinations. CFR proudly publishes *Vantage*: Journal of Thematic Analysis, a peer-reviewed, biannual, multidisciplinary, open-access e-journal that serves as a platform for scholarly expression and thematic exploration. In the academic year 2024–25, Vantage: Journal of Thematic Analysis released two thematic issues: Volume 5, Issue 2 (October, 2024) and Volume 6, Issue 1 (April, 2025). Both problems centred on the overarching theme "System of Knowledge in India: Moving Towards Self-Reliance," continuing the journal's commitment to exploring India's intellectual traditions through contemporary lenses. A significant milestone in the journal publishing system was achieved by transitioning to the globally recognised OJS-PKP (Open Journal Systems-Public Knowledge Project) platform, marking a significant leap forward in its professionalisation. This shift introduced an integrated online submission and peer review system, reinforcing our commitment to academic transparency, editorial integrity, and ethical publishing practices. The move not only streamlines operations but also enhances the journal's accessibility and credibility on the international platform.

#### **COLLEGE HOSTEL**

The academic year 2024–25 at Maitreyi College Girls' Hostel was marked by vibrant celebrations, spiritual engagement, and meaningful developmental activities that fostered a sense of community among the residents. Under the leadership of the Hostel Union, President Miss Palak and Secretary Miss Pragya, and with the guidance of Principal Prof. Haritma Chopra and Warden Dr. Pratibha Choudhury, the hostel became a space where tradition, joy, and personal growth coexisted seamlessly. The festive season began with Navratri, celebrated from 03rd to 11th October, 2024. Daily morning and evening aartis created a devotional rhythm to hostel life, while students observing fasts were served special 'vrat' meals including sabudana khichdi, fruits, tea, and vrat thalis. The celebrations culminated in Kanya Pujan, where nine young girls were honoured with a traditional meal of puri, halwa, and chana. The event fostered spiritual reflection and inclusiveness, appreciated by both staff and students. Diwali, celebrated on 31st October, 2024, brought warmth and festivity despite many residents being away. #### **DRAVYA**

DRAVYA- The Finance and Investment Cell of Maitreyi College is dedicated to promoting financial literacy and economic awareness among students. The cell strives to empower young minds with essential financial knowledge, cultivate investment acumen, and encourage the development of personal financial portfolios. Initially, the event Loot Scoot was organised on 11th September, 2024, with around 50 participants. The event combined finance and fun in a thrilling treasure hunt. Sparkles'24 was organised on 25th October, 2024, with over 50 participants. Celebrated during Diwali Mela, the event featured vibrant festivities and three creative games: Charades, Drawing Relay, and Card Matching. A Big Shot 3.0, a mock stock competition, was organised from 20th October to 05th November, 2024, and held online on the StockGro platform. With over 40 participants, the event provided a hands-on trading experience, helping students enhance their financial and investment skills. A seminar on 'Industry Trends and Career Opportunities in Finance' was then organised on 13th November, 2024, with around 40 participants. The speaker, Dr. Yogesh Ingle, shared valuable insights on career opportunities and industry trends in finance. Furthermore, the National Mock Stock Competition, organised by the profit pursuit, took place from 17-18th January, 2025, online on the StockGro platform. With over 40 participants, the competition challenged students to invest ₹10,00,000 in real-time stock trading virtually. The event involved collaboration, strategy, and quick decision-making. The competition 'Wheel to Wealth', organised under the annual cultural festival Rhapsody '25, was held on 12th February, 2025, with 51 participants. The event featured a finance quiz, an investment simulation, and a market outcome round, where teams virtually invested money, aiming to maximise their profits. A 'Financial Literacy Session' was conducted on 26th March, 2025, by five student members at Shristi Trust NGO, in collaboration with Rotaract DUSU. The interactive session focused on key topics such as saving, budgeting and digital payments. Monetrix '25, the flagship event of **DRAVYA**, was held on 17th April, 2025, with over 40 participants. The event featured a dynamic panel discussion on personal finance and fintech, offering valuable insights from experts. It also included interactive games like Buzz Folio and FraudFiles, making the session enriching for all attendees.

#### **ENABLING UNIT**

The Enabling Unit of Maitreyi College promotes the seamless inclusion of differently-abled students across academic and extracurricular activities. It provides computers and notebooks equipped with NVDA, OCR, and JAWS for visually impaired students, along with three printers, three computers, and three notebooks. Recently, it added the Kibo XS Device to scan and convert printed and handwritten material into audio. A dedicated book bank, extensive internet and printing facilities, and a "Writer and Reader Bank"—also open to other institutions—further support students' academic needs. The Enabling Unit conducted the following events and collaborated with the Equal Opportunity Cell (EOC) during the 2024-25 session. The Enabling Unit has renewed the Writer and Reader Bank for the 2024-25 session, adhering to the University of Delhi's new examination policy for Persons with Disabilities. On 14th August, 2024, the Enabling Unit organised a 'Pwd Teachers' Coordinators' Summit' at the Video Conferencing Room, Maitreyi College, where teacher representatives from various colleges of the University of Delhi and other institutions participated. In this meeting, the Saksham Teachers' Forum (STF) was formed to address matters related to PwD teachers across India. The Enabling Unit, in collaboration with the Department of Sanskrit, the EOC, and the Maharshi Patanjali Skill Enhancement Centre (MPSEC), organised a national lecture on "Exploring Procedural Parallels between Sanskrit Grammar and Artificial Intelligence" on 9th September, 2024. A total of 173 participants attended. The Enabling Unit, in collaboration with the Department of Sanskrit, the EOC, and the Maharshi Patanjali Skill Enhancement Centre (MPSEC), organised a national lecture on "Preranapunj Maitreyi" on 09th September, 2024. A total of 173 participants attended. On 23rd April, 2025, the Enabling Unit, in collaboration with the NSS Committee, organised "Astitva" to promote inclusivity. Over 300 participants, including more than 50 PwD participants, attended, making the event highly successful. Dr. Pramod Kumar Singh, Dr. Jyoti Singh, Dr. Smriti Singh, Dr. Akash Pratap Singh, and Mr. Yogesh Chaurasia assisted PwD students during the admission process this year. Fee concessions were granted to PwD students by Delhi University's guidelines. As the Coordinator of the Enabling Unit, Dr. Pramod Kumar Singh represented the college at various seminars, conferences, meetings, and workshops on disabilities and social issues at Delhi University and other institutions, including colleges, universities, institutes, and NGOs. Ms. Smriti Singh also represented the college in numerous government and private sector forums, organising several programs on disability in collaboration with other institutions.

#### **ENACTUS**

Enactus Maitreyi, a student-led non-profit organisation, aims to uplift marginalised communities through entrepreneurial action. Standing for Entrepreneurial Action for the US, it promotes social and economic development through innovative business practices. Enactus Maitreyi's two projects, **Project Misbah** and **Project Swarnim**, were showcased at various stalls in multiple institutions. The beneficiaries of Project Misbah are rescued sex workers, and for Project Swarnim, we aim to empower women in slum areas to achieve financial independence. The stalls were exhibited in many Universities and colleges, including Lady Shri Ram College on 24th October, 2024, Hansraj College on 23rd October, 2024, Kamala Nehru College on 15th October, 2024, Gargi College on 04th March, 2025, IIIT Delhi on 09th March, 2025, and Maharaja Agrasen Institute of Management on 02nd April, 2025. At Maitreyi College itself, stalls were held during Orientation on 29th August, 2024, the Freshers Event on 18th October, 2024, Sparkles'24 on 25th October, 2024, and Rhapsody'25 on 11th and 12th April, 2025. Outside the student realm, Enactus Maitreyi had stalls at the Country Club at Sainik Farms on 24th October, 2024 and at the British

High Commission on 25th October, 2024. All these stalls helped the members improve negotiation skills through sales and aided networking and exposure. Enactus Maitreyi also held a visit to the Old Age Home at Nirman Vihar NGO on 06th October, 2024, where students had a conversation with the residents along with a fun jamming session. Additionally, a visit was made to Very Special Arts India, where college students conducted an art and reading workshop with underprivileged children. This engagement enhanced the sense of accountability, steadfastness, and authenticity. A **seminar** organised by the society on the enriching topic, "Career Options after Graduation" by Career Launcher. This interactive event provided a myriad of paths for our college students. Throughout the year, Enactus Maitreyi has also organised competitions, such as the Pitch Deck Competition at Rhapsody '25 on 12th April, 2025, named Sustainatainment. The tenure was closed with Envera '25, Maitreyi College's Annual Enactus Fest, which showcased innovation and social impact on 16th April, 2025, featuring various competitions, including Ecoverse, a short film competition; Echoes of Expression, an open mic; Enigma, a treasure hunt; and Enactank, a Shark Tank simulation. Many stalls were also held, including many Enactus stalls, along with a bonding workshop of Project Swarnim. The event was a great success, promoting positive change and community engagement.

#### **GARDEN COMMITTEE**

Maitreyi College boasts a diverse green cover comprising a myriad of trees, shrubs, herbs, and roses that enhance the ornamental exquisiteness of the college campus. This year, the enrichment of the garden flora was supported through several plantation drives. A total of 40 trees, including Kachnar, Pili Gulmohar, Kapok, Amaltas, Dhak, Babool, Jacaranda, Imli and Pangara, were planted, which have been recognised for their APTI value. The drive inaugurated by Prof D.B. Sahoo, Head, Department of Botany, saw enthusiastic participation from all departments of the college. Several saplings were also donated to nurture and maintain recycled waste bags for the students. Aligning with the motto of eco-consciousness, the practice of recycling waste, such as debris, to make compost and using twigs and branches to create fencing, support for growing plants, etc., was advocated, reducing the requirement for waste disposal. The same bio compost was utilised in the college to nurture plants and the lawn. Student volunteers named all the trees and plants, and their QR codes were created for ease of identification, thereby establishing a digital database of college flora. The highlight of the year was the construction of the Rock garden- "शीला वाटिका" using rocks sourced from the college campus. The new rock garden is currently supporting 65 species of succulents and cacti. The Rock Garden was highly appreciated. To align with this year's annual flower show's theme - Flora and Fabric, several initiatives were undertaken, including the construction of a hut based on the principle of sustainability by using recycled materials such as twigs and bamboo sticks sourced from the college campus and used fabrics. The college participated enthusiastically in the 67th Annual Flower Show 2025. A total of 24 prizes were won by Maitreyi College, displaying an exemplary show of the hard work and dedication of the malis and student volunteers. To our immense pride, Maitreyi Kutumb bagged first prize for the best rock garden - The Delhi College Cup, and for the bottle garden - The Flower Show Committee Cup. A special display nukkad natak was performed by students of the college, depicting the ethos of the college to spread awareness on the importance of cleanliness and green cover in the college. As has been the past practice, saplings raised in the college nursery were presented for the felicitation of visiting guests in the college. Support for the student-centric start-up, "Gulistan", was also provided throughout the year.

#### **HEALTH & HYGIENE**

The Health and Hygiene Committee has actively contributed towards promoting well-being, awareness, and cleanliness in our college from June, 2024 to May, 2025. Throughout the year, we organised a variety of impactful events that aimed to improve both physical and mental health among students. We began our yearly activities by celebrating International Yoga Day, emphasising the importance of yoga for physical and psychological fitness. To ensure the wellbeing of our students, we successfully organised three health check-up camps within the college premises. These camps received an overwhelming response, with approximately 3000 students participating and benefiting from free health consultations. In collaboration with Rotary, we also organised a **blood donation camp**, which saw active participation from both students and faculty, contributing to a noble cause. Furthering our commitment to health education, we conducted introductory awareness sessions on 'Basic Life Support (BLS) and First Aid', equipping students with essential life-saving skills. Understanding the importance of early detection and awareness, we hosted a special session on cancer awareness, which helped students understand preventive measures and the significance of regular check-ups. Another major initiative was our 17-day campaign under Swachhata Pakhwada, during which we cleaned different local areas each day and planted various types of seeds, promoting environmental cleanliness and sustainability. One of our most impactful steps this year was the implementation of the ABHA ID card initiative, which ensured that every student received their unique health ID under the Ayushman Bharat scheme. Additionally, we organised a seminar on 'Narratives of Difference' and launched a 'Project Challenge', focusing on awareness and CPR training. Through these events, the Health and Hygiene Committee has fostered a culture of care, cleanliness, and consciousness among students, leaving a lasting impact on the college community.

#### HORIZON- THE PLACEMENT CELL

In the academic year 2024-2025, Maitreyi College focused on both internships and holistic career development. The Placement Cell organised seminars and webinars on topics like body-positive dressing, resume building, interview preparation, UPSC guidance, and tips for off-campus internships. Industry professionals from NIIT, Next IAS, Marks & Spencer, Pratham Test Prep, **PWC,** and **T.I.M.E.** led these sessions, offering students valuable insights into various career paths. On the placement front, students received offers from top recruiters such as Crowe, Deloitte, Airtel, Nestlé, ICICI Bank, Accenture, and Urban Company. The highest package, ₹24.8 LPA, was offered by D.E. Shaw, reflecting the academic calibre of Maitreyi students and the Cell's efforts in securing high-value opportunities. The Cell also facilitated internships across various domains, including Marketing, Finance, Consulting, and Content. The program Envision 7.0 saw recordbreaking participation with over 400 pre-registrations and numerous walk-ins. The event combined placement drives, workshops, and sessions, offering a comprehensive professional exposure to students. This year's online engagement was exceptional, with combined views across the Placement Cell and Envision 7.0 Instagram pages reaching 467K during the Envision period, accompanied by over 1,000 new followers and high content interaction through shares and saves. The report reflects the Placement Cell's commitment to empowering students through industry connections, real-world exposure, and meaningful learning experiences.

#### **INTERNAL COMMITTEE**

The Internal Committee of Maitreyi College organised lectures by Prof. Anupama Mahajan and Advocate Ms. Arsheya Mithal on sexual harassment at the workplace to raise awareness among

students and employees about the Vishakha guidelines, POSH Act, and the legal position in India regarding sexual harassment of women at the workplace. Additionally, a one-day inter-college festival, **Adamya**, was organised to provide a platform for college students to showcase their talents and creativity, while also promoting the important message of the IC.

#### INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL (IQAC)

During the academic year 2024-25, the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), with the continuous and firm support of administrative and non-teaching staff, continued to serve as the cornerstone of Maitreyi College's participatory and inclusive governance. IQAC streamlined academic and administrative coordination through regular meetings with department representatives and core members, enabling integrated planning and effective implementation. As an IQAC initiative, the college signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with UGC-MMTTC (UGC-Madan Mohan Malaviya Teacher Training Centre), SGTB Khalsa College, University of Delhi, to organise faculty-centred programmes for quality assurance. The IQAC recognised the urgent need to equip faculty members with cutting-edge tools. To ensure our faculty remains at the forefront of academic and technological advancements, the IQAC organised a one-week National Faculty Development Programme on "Reinventing Pedagogy in the Age of AI: Methods, Approaches, and Perspectives" from 16th to 22nd January, 2025, in collaboration with UGC-MMTTC under the convenorship of Prof. Meena Yadav. The IQAC also organised an "NEP Orientation and Sensitisation Programme" in partnership with UGC-MMTTC from 02nd -11th December, 2024, with Prof. Meena Yadav as a core team member. Additionally, the IQAC hosted an insightful interactive session titled "Empowering Lives, Securing Futures: India Post Savings for a Better Tomorrow" by India Post officials on 02nd December, 2024. The event was convened by Prof. Meena Yadav, with Mr. Saurav Kumar serving as the event coordinator. This session proved valuable for teaching as well as non-teaching staff and enhanced their awareness about postal services and related opportunities. To foster a culture of academic excellence and motivation among students, IQAC has instituted the 'Meritorious Student Award'. The award will be conferred during the Annual Day celebration to recognise outstanding academic performance. Students will receive personalised 'Student cards' to document their academic, co-curricular, industry-linked, and outreach achievements. A structured, point-based system will be used to assess these parameters holistically. A total of twelve students—one each from the Sciences, Commerce, and Humanities streams across the 1st, 2nd, 3rd and 4th years—will be selected for this award. To recognise and acknowledge multifaceted contributions of faculty members academic, administrative, and beyond-IQAC has initiated the process for institution of the 'Faculty Excellence Awards' to celebrate and incentivise their dedication. Screening for these awards will be done in accordance with the UGC guidelines and other guidelines formulated by IQAC, to evaluate their academic and other professional achievements. The awards will be conferred during the Annual Day celebration, reinforcing a culture of appreciation and professional motivation. IQAC, with the support of administrative staff, facilitated faculty **promotions** by implementing the UGC's Performance-Based Appraisal Scheme (PBAS), under the Career Advancement Scheme (CAS) 2010 and CAS 2018. IQAC successfully submitted the Annual Quality Assurance Report (AQAR) for the year 2023-24 to NAAC promptly, and the college annual report to University of Delhi for 2024-25. Additionally, IQAC timely and successfully submitted data for NIRF and India Today rankings. To summarise, the academic year 2024-25 was a landmark period for IQAC, marked by the launch of several impactful initiatives aimed at enhancing educational quality, promoting excellence, and fostering a culture of recognition and continuous improvement.

#### MERAKI- THE ENTREPRENEURSHIP CELL

The academic year 2024-25 was a landmark period for Meraki, marked by a sequence of impactful events and initiatives designed to nurture entrepreneurial skills, innovation, and startup culture among students. The Cell actively engaged in national exhibitions, hosted internal entrepreneurial sessions, and organised bazaars that provided real-world business experience. The primary activities and events included the 'International Skill, Start-up and Entrepreneurship **Exhibition'** from 4th to 6th September, 2024, which was held at the Sports Complex, University of Delhi. This 3-day exhibition brought together startups nationwide, celebrating India's Mushroom Day 2024, where Meraki showcased student startups such as Vista, Artisto, IndoLifestyle, Gulistan, Swan Bakery, and Ribbon Nestle. The highlights included the presentation of a handpainted Mithila Art shawl to MP Mr. Manoj Tiwari, who praised the craftsmanship. The team received the 'Best Innovation Award'. Riya Aggarwal, co-founder of Riding Rangers, was recognised among the top five startups and secured mentorship and collaboration with the University of Delhi. Next, the entrepreneurship session 'Igniting Innovation', conducted by faculty and coordinators for students enrolled in the SEC paper 'Innovation and Entrepreneurship', took place. The session introduced the Entrepreneurship Cell's role and emphasised the importance of hackathons as platforms for practical innovation and collaboration. Students were encouraged to participate in hackathons to develop entrepreneurial skills. The outcomes included enhanced understanding of startup dynamics, innovation, and practical problem-solving. Following this, Startup Bazaars were hosted on campus, featuring eight stalls showcasing diverse student ventures, including handmade crafts, customised t-shirts, jewellery, candles, traditional footwear, stationery, homemade food, and medicinal plants. The bazaar created networking opportunities with investors and mentors, helping participants refine business models and pitch skills. The event successfully promoted entrepreneurship and creativity on campus. Maitreyi College proudly showcases a vibrant entrepreneurial spirit among its students and alumni through diverse startups. Indolifestyle by Economics alumna Anushka Karan promotes Indian heritage through handcrafted art-inspired products, while Beady Babe by Simran (B.A. Prog.) offers unique beaded jewellery. AScented Candles by alumna Srashti Agrawal specializes in eco-friendly, customizable candles, and *Padukayein* by Vaishnavi Mohanpuria (Zoology) revives traditional juttis. Swan Bakery by M. Laxmi Prasanna (B.A. Prog.) offers homemade baked goods, and Ribbon Nestle by Chhama Jaiswal (B.A. Prog.) features handmade satin crochet bags. The Garden Committee's Gulistan, led by Priyanshi Gautam, promotes eco-friendly products using dried plants and recycled materials. Tea Bear by Khushi and Tisha Goyal (Mathematics and English) and Gallan Mithiyan by Economics student Sanchi Guglani focus on delightful baked treats. Creative ventures like Jewels by Bhavya (Bhavya Ahuja, English), কলো কা eARTh (Anshika Avani, English alumna), and *Tulips and Lilies* by Manya Gaur (B.Com. Prog.) offer handmade jewellery, art, and stylish accessories, reflecting both innovation and cultural pride.

Further, Meraki organised the **Skill Enhancement Workshops** and **Mentorship Programs**, focusing on business planning, digital marketing, financial literacy, and product development throughout the year. Mentorship sessions connected students with industry experts and alumni entrepreneurs, guiding startup challenges and growth strategies. Meraki partnered with other university entrepreneurship cells and organizations like Enactus Rajguru College for joint events and knowledge sharing. These collaborations expanded networking horizons and introduced students to broader entrepreneurial ecosystems. Students actively participated in hackathons, business plan competitions, and innovation challenges, gaining exposure and honing their

entrepreneurial skills. The Cell encouraged and supported these participations, helping students apply classroom learning in real-world scenarios.

#### NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

Deputy Director of NCWEB, **Dr. Surendra Singh**, graced the occasion as Chief Guest. Sports Day was celebrated on 23rd February, 2025, where students, faculty, and staff came together for a day of healthy competition and sporting spirit. Events like races, team games, and fun contests brought energy and companionship to the campus. To familiarize students with the digital resources available to them, a DU E-Library Workshop was organized on 08th March, 2025, which also coincided with International Women's Day. It aimed at training students to access and utilize academic resources effectively. The student's academic excellence was supplemented by their remarkable achievement in extra-curricular activities by winning the second prize in the Intercollege dance festival held as a part of the NCWEB Annual Day celebrations held at Satyawati College, which highlights their ability to balance academics with their skills and creativity. The list of courses consists of French Certificate Course, Legal Literacy with NDDLSA, Python Programming (Department of Computer Science), Youth Empowerment Skill Program in collaboration with The Art of Living, Emotional Wellness, and First Aid in collaboration with Sleepwell Foundation, Product Designing with Arduino (Department of Physics) in collaboration with NSUT.

#### STUDENTS' UNION

As the 2024-25 year comes to an end, the Students' Union of Maitreyi College, University of Delhi, marks this year with growth and immense success. From mentoring freshers to encouraging democratic participation in every aspect of theatre-making, we continue to grow as artists and individuals. We thank our faculty advisors, the college administration, and our fellow societies for their support. #### ACHIEVEMENT CELL

The Achievement Cell at Maitreyi College recognizes the accomplishments of high-achieving students and provides them with opportunities for growth. Similar to Forbes 30 Under 30 but focused on youth, it aims to celebrate early career achievements and offer inspiration for the next steps in students' journeys. #### **GALORE - THE FASHION SOCIETY**

The society also collaborated on a photoshoot with Drushyam, the Photography Society of JNU, and organized workshops on ramp walks, styling, and team etiquette. Galore strengthened its online presence with creative and behind-the-scenes content, winning multiple awards for Best Concept, Best Styling, and Best Walk at several fests, cementing its place as both a performer and organizer in the fashion scene.

#### MARKETRICKS - THE MARKETING SOCIETY

Marketricks, the Marketing Society of Maitreyi College, successfully hosted multiple dynamic events in 2024–25. Both events saw enthusiastic participation from DU colleges, with exceptional performances and positive feedback. The society also secured top positions at institutions like Delhi Technological University and Hansraj College, with a total of over 20 awards across the season. **Solo classical dancer Shruti** added to the glory with podium finishes at Lady Irwin College, NDIM, and others. Riyaaz, the Indian Music Society of Maitreyi College, had a vibrant and fulfilling year marked by musical excellence, teamwork, and innovation. Under the dynamic leadership of the council— Diya Bhuwania (President), Priyanshi Rawat (Vice President), Vaishnavi Dubey (Session Head), Sumedha Sharma (Treasurer), Pratishtha (General Secretary), and Tanvi Joshi (PR Head)—the society nurtured talent while upholding its commitment to Indian classical and semi-classical music. The year began with an enthusiastic audition drive in September, 2024, welcoming a diverse and talented group of vocalists. Regular weekly sessions focused on rigorous training in raaga development, taal mastery, and ensemble coordination, creating a strong foundation for performance. Throughout the academic session, Riyaaz actively participated in various intercollege competitions, earning accolades in both group and solo categories. The group secured 1st Prize at Swaranjali'24 (IIT Roorkee), and 2nd Prizes at Bandish'24 (Lady Hardinge Medical College), Saptak'25 (Maharaja Surajmal Institute), and Sur-Sangam'25 (PGDAV Evening College). In solo performances, members Vaishnavi Dubey and Tanvi Joshi brought further glory to the society with numerous wins, including 1st positions at Sri Aurobindo College and Rajdhani College, and 2nd and 3rd positions at Shri Guru Gobind Singh College, Kalindi College, and the **Faculty of Music**. Riyaaz continues to be a vibrant space where passion meets discipline, providing its members with not just musical training but also a sense of community, creative expression, and personal growth.

#### TRENCHANT - THE ENGLISH DEBATING SOCIETY

Trenchant, the English Debating Society of Maitreyi College, thrives on fearless expression, critical thought, and principled engagement. Comprising three dynamic wings—Parliamentary Debate (PD), Model United Nations (MUN), and Creative Writing (CW) —the society fosters skills in argumentation, diplomacy, and imaginative expression. The 2024–25 session began with rigorous offline training and weekend review sessions across all wings. MUN and PD facilitated thought-provoking debates and mock sessions, while CW explored genres, rewrote narratives, and contributed as International Press in MUNs. Trenchant successfully organized three major events this year. 'Speak and Conquer' (11th February, 2025), a soliloquy competition under Rhapsody, explored "Shades of Morality" through monologues of morally grey characters, blending performance and critical insight. Sashakt (05th April, 2025), a conventional debate, challenged "The Rise of Manifestation Culture," prompting critical reflection on modern self-help ideologies. Most notably, Maitreyi Model United Nations (22-23rd March, 2025) marked the

society's first independent MUN, featuring four committees and wide participation, cementing Trenchant's role in fostering informed, articulate global citizens.

आख्यान '24 के अंतर्गत आज़ादी का अमृत महोत्सव के अवसर पर दिनांक 15 अगस्त को टर्नकोट वाद-विवाद प्रतियोगिता का आयोजन गूगल मीट के माध्यम से किया गया। प्रतियोगिता का विषय था – "यह सदन भारत राष्ट्र के विकास हेतु भारत में प्रादेशिक राष्ट्रवाद की तुलना में सांस्कृतिक राष्ट्रवाद को बेहतर विकल्प मानता है।" सत्र की अंतिम प्रतियोगिता "विदुषी मैत्रेयी स्मृति संसदीय वाद-विवाद प्रतियोगिता" (द्वितीय संस्करण) का आयोजन 7-8 नवंबर को महाविद्यालय परिसर में तीन चरणों – कार्टर फाइनल, सेमी फाइनल और फाइनल – में संपन्न हुआ। इसमें 32 टीमों ने भाग लिया और 16 आमंत्रित अधिनिर्णायक उपस्थित रहे। "वाणी 4.0", नवागंतुक संसदीय वाद-विवाद प्रतियोगिता, 8-9 नवंबर को आयोजित हुई। पहले चरण का आयोजन गूगल मीट पर हुआ, जबिक अंतिम चरण कॉलेज परिसर में हुआ। 30 टीमों ने भाग लिया, प्रत्येक चरण के लिए अलग विषय निर्धारित थे, और 15 अधिनिर्णायकों ने मूल्यांकन किया। वार्षिक महोत्सव रैप्सोडी 2025 के अंतर्गत समिति द्वारा "दृष्टिकोण 4.0" का आयोजन किया गया। इसमें दो प्रतियोगिताएँ शामिल थीं— "पारंपरिक वाद-विवाद प्रतियोगिता" (11 फरवरी) जिसमें 20 प्रतिभागियों ने भाग लिया, और "काव्य पाठ प्रतियोगिता" (12 फरवरी) जिसमें 10 प्रतिभागियों ने अपनी प्रस्तुति दी। दोनों कार्यक्रम महाविद्यालय परिसर में संपन्न हुए।यह सत्र तर्क, अभिव्यक्ति और भाषायी दक्षता के सशक्त प्रदर्शन का साक्षी रहा।

#### 9. SOCIAL INITIATIVES OF THE DEPARTMENTS/SOCIETIES

Maitreyi College has demonstrated a strong and sustained commitment to social responsibility through a wide array of student-led initiatives and institutional collaborations. The NCC cadets were actively engaged throughout the year in numerous social service campaigns, including **tree plantation drives**, the **Save Yamuna movement**, **cleanliness programs**, and **initiatives to combat food wastage.** The NSS unit, in collaboration with the Rotaract Club of Delhi Midtown Maitreyi, organized several impactful events with community service at their core. These included a **Peace Walk** in solidarity with the Kolkata rape case victim, the **RAHA campaign** on sex education and

women's safety, a **Thalassemia Awareness Talk Show**, a **self-defense workshop**, and **Project Chakra Shakti** focusing on menstrual health awareness.

The Rotaract Club also engaged students through its Club Service initiatives, including the Friendship Day celebration "Core Connection," an Orientation Programme for new members, and the entertaining "Bingo Bonanza." Inter-club collaboration was fostered through the first zonal online meet "ROWENA." Under Vocational Service, activities like a Social Media Team **Competition** and the **District Training Seminar** "Albus Assembly" offered leadership development and creative engagement. In the sphere of International Service, the "Kindness Act," a joint initiative with Zones Ravenclaw and Gryffindor, promoted compassion and civic values. The club also collaborated on events such as "Fun Day" with RAC Delhi South East and Young Visionaries and participated in district-level projects like SportsMania. Prakriti, the Eco Club of Maitreyi College, contributed to environmental consciousness by organizing a plantation drive and screening a short film on environmental awareness. In tandem, the Internal Committee hosted lectures by Prof. Anupama Mahajan and advocate Ms. Arsheya Mithal to educate students and staff on the Vishakha Guidelines, the POSH Act, and India's legal framework regarding sexual harassment at the workplace. The Women's Development Cell furthered this cause through a range of events and talks on workplace harassment and gender sensitization. Inclusivity remained a core value across college activities, most notably showcased during Astitva, the annual NSS fest, which featured diverse outreach initiatives. The Department of Political Science, in collaboration with the Institute of Constitutional and Parliamentary Studies, organized a training program titled Empowering Youth with Constitutional Values and Fundamental Duties, aimed at deepening students' understanding of democratic responsibilities and constitutional ethics. The Electoral Literacy Club (ELC) also promoted democratic participation by raising awareness about the Saksham-ECI app, which aids Persons with Disabilities (PwDs) in accessing voting facilities. Enactus Maitreyi further advanced the college's social impact through its flagship initiatives—Project Misbah, supporting the rehabilitation of rescued sex workers, and Project Swarnim, empowering women in slum areas by fostering financial independence. Together, these diverse initiatives reflect Maitreyi College's holistic and inclusive approach to student engagement, civic responsibility, and community development.
