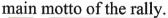


#### **RALLY FOR RIVERS**

### TRAINING AT ALZHEIMER'S RELATED DISORDER SOCIETY OF INDIA (ARDSI)

16<sup>th</sup> and 17<sup>th</sup> November, 2017 ORGANISED BY NSS UNIT, MAITREYI COLLEGE RESOURCE PERSONS: MR. Y.P SINGH, MRS. VEENA SACHDEVA AND REVA PURI

**Twelve NSS volunteers** attended the training for taking care of patients with Alzheimer's disease at Alzheimer's Related Disorder Society of India, Delhi Chapter, RZ-62, Gali No-9, Tughalkabad Extension, Panchvati Complex, (Landmark- Near Tara Apartment, Greater Kailash-II) for two days on November 16 and 17, 2017. The classes were conducted as per the following schedule:

- 1. 10:30am to 1:00 pm (1st half)
- 2. 1:00 pm to 2:00 pm (Lunch break)
- 3.2 pm to 4 pm 2 nd Half

It was a memorable experience for the volunteers. The training was conducted in such a way that it brought all the students together to think about this disorder. Each student was keen to know more and more about this. **The training was conducted by Mr. Y.P Singh**. It started with a slide show showing two major points that first, there is no "cure" of Alzheimer's disease till date. Secondly, it happens only after crossing the age of 60's. Alzheimer's is considered as mental disorder as memory is lost.

The two day workshop dealt with major things to be remembered. For example, it is not a matter of shame to be a child of Alzheimer's patient. It could happen with anyone but it happens very rarely with few people only. In this disorder there are three stages. In the first stage, the person will start forgetting about his daily routine very often. He may suddenly stop reading the newspaper which he used to do in his daily routine. In the second stage, the person would forget about all his life what he has done till now. His body would be mature but brain will work like a six months old child. He will need someone to take care of him all the time. In this stage, the person can also get hallucinations and delusion. They quoted some examples also. Like for example, in hallucinations, the person might think that someone is standing in front of him whom other people can't see. Or suddenly it is raining for him.

In case of delusion if there is white and black marbled floor, the person will not step on black tile because he will think that there is a hole in the floor or if there is a floral printed curtain, the person will start picking up the flowers considering them to be real. The third stage is the severe one where the person is so absent minded that he will not be even able to stand from his bed.

The volunteers were explained in detail about the problems faced by Alzheimer's patients. Solutions for such problems were suggested by Mrs. Veena Sachdeva and Reva Puri on the second day. The volunteers were sensitized about how to treat an Alzheimer's patient. They were taught about how to identify the different stages of such a patient. They were also told about how to get rid of the risk of getting Alzheimer's disease.

They told the volunteers about the patients' daily routine at ARDSI. A van picks them at sharp 7 am. They are then asked to do a little exercise like walking, etc. in the lawn. Then they are given tea break. After that they are given newspaper to read even if they are unable to do so. Then they are given paints, games, etc. so that these things can keep them busy. Then they are given food which they have brought with them from their homes. Then they are sent back by 4 so that they reach their homes before it's too dark.

At the end of the training, suggestions were taken from the volunteers about what are the other ways to deal with such patients. Lastly, the volunteers were asked what they would do if they had an Alzheimer's patient at their home; how they would treat him and what best would they do for him. They quoted "give them death with respect, dignity and love". Although death will come when it has to, but till then they also deserve all the care and love. It was an experience that none of the volunteers would ever forget. They were taught to keep patience. Sometimes it would be hard but for the patients, it is the hardest life. So, one should keep loving them, no matter what has changed.

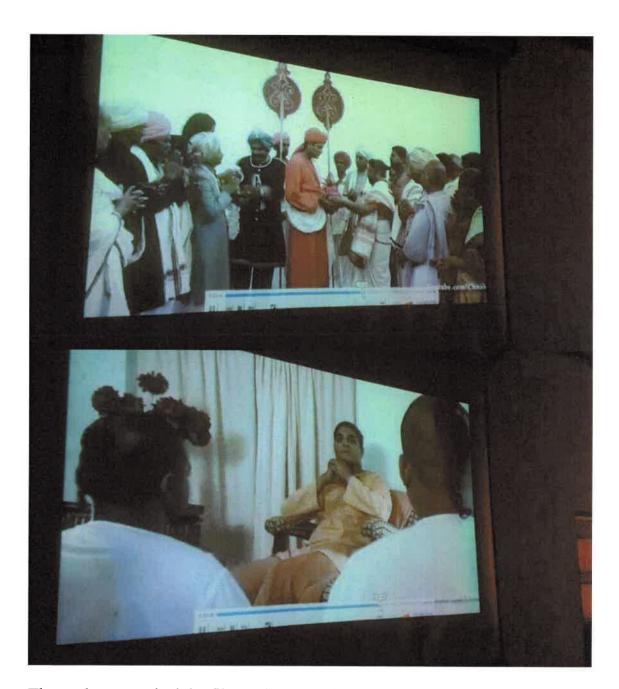
